Getting Started Responding to an Eviction Complaint

IMPORTANT: This getting started guide and the instructions are not legal advice. They are only meant to help you learn how to respond to an *Eviction Complaint*. Your use of the forms does not guarantee you will be successful in court.

To learn how to fill out the forms and file them with the court, read the HOW TO RESPOND TO AN EVICTION COMPLAINT instruction sheet and the instructions on the forms.

Names of the forms: Purpose of the forms:	 Appearance Eviction Answer, Defenses, and Counterclaims Additional Paragraphs for Answer/Response to Complaint/Petition Additional Bad Property Conditions Additional Affirmative Defenses/Counterclaims Appearance: To let the court and other party know that you plan to participate in the case. This is also how you request a trial by jury if you want to do that. Eviction Answer, Defenses, and Counterclaims: You are not required to file an Eviction Answer unless ordered to do so by the judge. Use this form to respond to the claims that the Plaintiff made in the Complaint. The Eviction Answer is where you say whether you agree or disagree with what the Plaintiff is claiming.
Types of cases the forms CAN be used for:	Residential evictions
Types of cases the forms CANNOT be used for:	 Cases other than evictions. The following types of eviction cases: Commercial Mobile homes Condominium owners being sued by the association Contracts for deed (also called rent to own agreements or installment sales agreements)
Cost to file the forms:	There is a fee for filing. If you cannot afford to pay the filing fee, you can ask the court to file for free or at a reduced cost by filing the <i>Application for Waiver of Court Fees</i> found at: <u>ilcourts.info/forms</u> .
Special information or papers needed to complete the forms:	You will need the <i>Eviction Complaint</i> , a copy of your lease (if you have one), and a copy of your eviction notice (if you received one).
