## **Courts as conveners and leaders**

Many mental health and justice professionals have noted that the system that manages both competence to stand trial (CST) evaluation and competence restoration (CR) processes in criminal cases is in crisis. As courts and mental health authorities across the nation face increasing numbers of cases involving the competence of defendants, system improvements and reforms have emerged as a national priority.

Acknowledging the Illinois CST/CR system has room for improvement, with support from the Illinois Supreme Court, the Special Advisory Committee for Justice and Mental Health Planning's Competency and Education Subcommittees planned and hosted "Rethinking the Intersection of Competency to Stand Trial, Competency Restoration, and Mental Health Systems."

#### **Resource: The Promise of 988**

The Illinois Department of Human Services/Division of Mental Health launched 988, a three-digit dialing code for the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline on July 16, 2022.

"For criminal justice stakeholders, 988 is an important opportunity to shift people in crisis toward appropriate care and ideally minimize contact with law enforcement and the justice system. To fully take advantage of this, however, criminal justice partners need to be aware of what 988 provides and prepare processes to appropriately direct people to 988 prior to contact with law enforcement and through to reentry."
