#### TRIBUTE TO HORACE L. CALVO

#### 1927-1991

#### Supreme Court Justice Fifth District

Horace L. Calvo was born in Chicago on January 4, 1927. He graduated from Springfield Junior College, the University of Illinois and St. Louis University Law School. From 1944 to 1947, he served in the U.S. Air Force. His distinguished law career began with his admission to the bar in 1956 after which time he was a solo practitioner in Granite City and in the firm of Calvo, Mateyka & Hill for 19 years. During that time he served as Assistant Attorney General and also served four terms as a Representative in the General Assembly. In 1975, he was appointed to the Third Judicial Circuit and won election to that position the following year. As a trial judge, Justice Calvo heard cases in the criminal felony division and in the civil law division for 12 years. He was assigned by the Supreme Court to the Fifth District Appellate Court in 1987 and elected to the Supreme Court in November, 1988, where he served until his death on June 3, 1991.

Justice Calvo served as president of the Illinois Judges Association and chairman of the Illinois Courts Commission. He also served as chairman of the Civil Law Committee for the 1987 Judicial Conference and as vice-chairman of the Executive Committee's Subcommittee on Legislation. In addition, he was a member of the American, Illinois, Madison County and Tri-City Bar Associations.

#### **BENJAMIN K. MILLER NAMED CHIEF JUSTICE**

Benjamin K. Miller has been selected as chief justice for a three-year term commencing January 1, 1991. Justice Miller succeeds Thomas J. Moran who had been chief justice since January 1, 1988.

Chief Justice Miller was elected to the supreme court in 1984. Prior to his election, he was a judge of the Appellate Court for the Fourth Judicial District from 1982 until 1984. He began his judicial career in 1976 when the supreme court appointed him as a circuit judge of the Seventh Judicial Circuit, a post to which he was elected in 1978. During his service on the trial court, he was presiding judge of the Sangamon County Circuit Court Criminal Felony Division and chief judge of the Seventh Circuit. By special assignment, he was the trial judge in the "Pontiac 17" prison riot murder case, during 1979-81, tried in Chicago on a judge of venue.

Chief Justice Miller is a graduate of Southern Illinois University of Carbondale and Vanderbilt University law school in Nashville, Tennessee. Upon his admission to the Illinois Bar in 1961, he engaged in the private practice of law in Springfield, devoting most of his practice to civil litigation. He was a member of a number of Springfield business and charitable organizations, and national, local and state bar associations, including the Illinois State Bar Association where he served as a member of the Board of Governors, as Treasurer, and on numerous committees and section councils.

Chief Justice Miller has been a special assistant attorney general, vice-chairman of the Springfield Election Commission, and a member of the board of directors of the Illinois Bar Foundation and Illinois Bar Automated Research Foundation. He served by appointment of the supreme court as a member of a committee to study Illinois rules of evidence.

In addition to those duties associated with being a judge of the supreme court, Chief Justice Miller is currently a member of the Board of Directors of the American Judicature Society, has served as chairman of the Illinois Courts Commission from 1988 to 1991, and as the court's liaison to the IPI-Criminal Jury Instructions Committee and the Rules Committee. He has served as liaison to the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges.

#### THE SUPREME COURT

#### ORGANIZATION

The Supreme Court, highest tribunal in the Illinois judicial system, consists of seven judges, each of whom is elected to serve a ten year term. Three judges are elected from the First Judicial District and one judge from each of the other four Judicial Districts. A map of the judicial districts of the supreme and appellate courts is shown in Appendix D. A diagram of the Illinois judicial system is shown in Appendix F. Four judges constitute a quorum and the concurrence of four is necessary for a decision. A chief justice is selected from among the judges to serve a three year term. (III. Const. 1970, art. VI, secs. 2, 3 and 10.)

The Court is in session in Springfield, and occasionally in Chicago, for five terms each year during the months of January, March, May, September, and November. At each term the Court issues opinions, holds conferences, hears oral arguments, rules on motions, considers modifications to Supreme Court rules, and meets with the Administrative Director to consider administrative and budgetary matters.

#### JURISDICTION

The Supreme Court may exercise original jurisdiction in cases relating to revenue, mandamus, prohibition or habeas corpus and as may be necessary to the complete determination of any case on review. As a matter of right, the Court hears appeals from judgments of circuit courts imposing death sentences. The Court also hears appeals, as a matter of right, from the appellate court which involve a question arising under the U.S. Constitution, or, under the Illinois Constitution, provided the issue arises for the first time in and as a result of the action of the appellate court, or, if a division of the appellate court certifies that a case decided by it involves a question of such importance that the case should be decided by the Supreme Court. (III. Const. 1970, art. VI, sec. 4.)

#### ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY

General administrative and supervisory authority over the unified court system is vested in the Supreme Court by the Constitution. To aid the Chief Justice in exercising this authority, the Court appoints an Administrative Director and staff. (III. Const. 1970, art. VI, sec. 16.) In addition, the Constitution identifes specific administrative powers which the Court shall or may exercise. These powers include prescribing the number of appellate divisions in each judicial district, assigning judges to appellate divisions, prescribing the time and place for appellate divisions to sit, providing for the manner of appointing associate judges, providing for matters assignable to associate judges, filling judicial vacancies by appointment in the absence of a law, prescribing rules of conduct for judges, assigning retired judges to judicial service, temporarily assigning judges, providing for an annual judicial conference and reporting thereon annually in writing to the General Assembly, and appointing nonjudicial officers of the Court.

The Court exercises other administrative functions pursuant to statute or through power inherent in the operation of the Court. The annual judicial budget, prepared by the Administrative Director, is approved by the Court. The Court also appoints the State Appellate Defender and two persons to the State Appellate Defender Commission and three judges to the Board of Trustees of the Judges Retirement System. From time to time, the Court appoints committees to study and suggest amendments in substantive and procedural law, rules of court, and other matters affecting the administration of justice.

#### **1991 SUPREME COURT CASELOAD SUMMARY**

During 1991, cases filed in the Supreme Court of Illinois totaled 2,718 on the three dockets, a 3.3% increase in total case filings from 1990. There was a gain of 79 cases on the General Docket, which is the predominant docket, a 4.8% increase over 1990 filings, for a total of 1,723 General Docket cases filed, including 24 appeals from statutes held unconstitutional and 26 appeals in death penalty cases. The Court disposed of 2,685 cases, a 5.9% increase in dispositions from the previous years.

The Court filed 116 full opinions disposing of 133 cases; ruled on 51 petitions for rehearing; and disposed of 1,470 petitions for leave to appeal, allowing 124 petitions or 8.4%, one less petition than allowed in 1990. As in prior years, more civil petitions were allowed than people's (criminal) petitions although typically more people's petitions are filed. In addition, the Court imposed discipline in 82 attorney discipline cases.

The Court considered approximately 1,950 motions on the General Docket alone; including 87 original action motions under Rule 381 and 383, generally cases in which the Court is asked to review interlocutory decisions of lower courts. The Court entertained oral argument in 153 cases, and 2 cases were submitted on briefs, for a total 155 cases taken under advisement in 1991, which is a 15% increase in submissions from 1990.

The Court licensed 2,975 attorneys in 1991, a 12.8% increase over 1990 admissions to the bar.

#### OFFICERS APPOINTED BY THE SUPREME COURT

#### THE CLERK OF THE SUPREME COURT

Juleann Hornyak has served as the Clerk of the Illinois Supreme Court since her appointment in July, 1982. The Clerk is responsible for processing cases and other filings and maintaining dockets, records, files, and statistics on the activities of the Court.

The Clerk maintains two offices: the main office (with 11 deputy clerks) in the Supreme Court Building in Springfield and a satellite office (with two deputy clerks) in the Richard J. Daley Center in Chicago. The Springfield office is a full-service operation. The satellite office, opened in 1986, accommodates the filing and processing of motions and corresponding orders from the populous First District, distributes opinions, rule changes and other announcements simultaneously with their release in Springfield, and addresses case-related and procedural inquiries from the public.

The foremost responsibility of the Clerk's office is assisting the Court in the management of its caseload, which is contained on three separate dockets. Maintaining these dockets consists of checking to see that tendered cases are within the Court's jurisdiction, that documents are in proper form and that parties otherwise conform to the applicable Supreme Court rules, that filing dates are met so that cases can proceed according to schedule, and that matters are presented to the Court for disposition at the appropriate time. The Clerk's office monitors the flow of cases from initiation to the issuance of mandates and final orders.

In addition to case-related responsibilities, the Clerk's office is responsible for the following:

- Maintaining the roll of attorneys licensed to practice in Illinois;
- Processing the licensing of attorneys and coordinating the semi-annual admission ceremonies;
- Registering and renewing professional service corporations and associations engaged in the practice of law;
- 4. Filing judicial financial disclosure statements; and
- 5. Serving as a public information office of the Court.

#### THE SUPREME COURT MARSHAL

Since her appointment in 1989, Carolyn D. Taitt has served as Marshal of the Illinois Supreme Court.

The Marshal oversees all renovations, repairs, and daily maintenance of the Supreme Court building and grounds; maintains security for all employees of the building and all Justices around the clock; extends courtesies and welcome mats to all groups and/or individuals seeking a tour of the building, and shares her knowledge of not only the facilities but also the history of the Court with those interested in learning about the general day-to-day operations of the Supreme Court. In fulfilling these responsibilities, the Marshal oversees a staff of fifteen employees.

In addition, the Marshal attends all sessions of the Court, both in Springfield and Chicago, and performs other duties at the direction of the Court, including serving legal documents on individual attorneys in disciplinary matters.

#### **REPORTER OF DECISIONS**

The Office of the Reporter of Decisions for the Illinois Supreme and Appellate Courts publishes the opinions of the Supreme Court and the Appellate Court in the softback Official Reports Advance Sheets, and the hardbound Illinois Reports, Second Series, and the Illinois Appellate Reports, Third Series. In 1991, the office published six volumes of the Illinois Reports, and sixteen volumes of the Illinois Appellate Reports, along with the bi-weekly Advance Sheets. Seventeen full-time staff members at the Reporter's office in Bloomington prepare the reviewing courts' opinions for publications by verifying all case citations, editing the opinions for style and grammar, and composing head notes, attorney lines, tables of cases, topical summaries, and indices. Additionally, typesetting of the Official Reports is performed in-house.

Brian C. Ervin has served as Reporter of Decisions since 1987.

#### SUPREME COURT LIBRARIAN

Brenda I. Larison was appointed Supreme Court Librarian in July, 1991. She received her Masters in Library Science from the University of Michigan. She previously had been Head Librarian at the Illinois Legislative Research Unit. The Supreme Court Librarian is responsible for directing all of the operations of the library and the acquisition of research materials for the Supreme Court. During 1991, Christine A. Clatt continued to assist the Supreme Court Librarian in her position as Librarian.

The staff of the Supreme Court Library provides research and reference assistance to the Supreme Court. The library contains over 85,000 volumes, consisting of federal and state primary authority, as well as secondary authority, such as encyclopedias, treatises, Restatements, loose-leaf services, case digests, ALR's and over 500 serial titles, specializing in Illinois, labor, tax, and criminal law. The library serves the Supreme Court, the state judiciary, other state government, the bar and the public.

#### THE SUPREME COURT RESEARCH DEPARTMENT

The Research Department, headed by Director of Legal Research, Douglas K. Smith, is responsible for performing a variety of tasks which aid the Court in the disposition of appeals. Specifically, research attorneys provide a variety of legal research and writing assignments which include preparation of memoranda on pending petitions for leave to appeal, cases briefed and ready for oral argument, and full-court motions. Research attorneys also assist in drafting supervisory orders and participate in special research projects for the Court.

During 1991, the Research Department staff consisted of the Director, six research attorneys, an administrative secretary and two secretaries.

This report is submitted in accordance with section 17 of Article VI of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 which provides: "The Supreme Court shall provide by rule for an annual judicial conference to consider the work of the courts and to suggest improvements in the administration of justice and shall report thereon annually in writing to the General Assembly..."

The Supreme Court is committed to the effective administration of justice and the management of the courts, to the careful stewardship of those resources provided for the operation of the courts, and to the development of plans and goals designed to assure improvements in the Illinois court system in meeting the needs of our citizens. The Supreme Court, in conjunction with the American Judicature Society, will this year hold a conference on the Future of the Courts in Illinois.

In recent years, the Supreme Court has recommended that the General Assembly address the issue of state funding of the Circuit Courts. In light of the fiscal crisis, that recommendation is not contained in this year's report. The Court will renew this recommendation in a future report.

Keeping in mind the separate roles of the Supreme Court and the General Assembly, we do not intend to intrude upon the prerogatives of the General Assembly in determining what legislation should be enacted. It is gratifying, however, to note that the General Assembly, over the years, has acted to implement many of the suggestions made by the Court.

### THE SUPREME COURT ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

#### Section I. General Policy Concerns.

#### 1. JUDICIAL ADVISORY COUNCIL.

In the years that it was in operation, the Judicial Advisory Council played a constructive role in providing a forum for the consideration and resolution of a number of issues related to the Judicial Branch of government. One of the most important functions was to advise the General Assembly of the impact on the Judicial Branch of proposed legislation. The Council was a committee consisting of legislators and attorneys from throughout the State which met periodically to consider issues and problems as they related to the Judicial Branch and to develop solutions to those issues. These were then presented to the General Assembly.

The Supreme Court suggests that the General Assembly revive the Judicial Advisory Council.

#### 2. STATUTE REQUIRING JUDICIAL NOTE ON CERTAIN LEGISLATION SHOULD BE FOLLOWED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The Supreme Court is deeply concerned about the purpose or effect of a bill which is to directly or indirectly increase the number of judges in Illinois without an assessment of the judiciary as a whole, and urges the General Assembly to invoke the Judicial Note Act (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 63, par. 42.61 *et seq.*) whenever the purpose or effect of a bill or a bill amendment is to directly or indirectly increase, or decrease, the number of judges in Illinois.

#### Section II. Recent opinions of the Supreme and Appellate Courts that suggest legislative action.

#### 1. PROVIDE CONSISTENCY BETWEEN THE MANDA-TORY RETIREMENT PROVISIONS OF INVESTIGA-TORS OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE AND THE AGE DISCRIMINATION PROHIBITION OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS ACT.

In <u>State of Illinois v. Mikusch</u> (1990), 138 III. 2d 242, the Supreme Court held that the mandatory retirement provisions of Section 2-115 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (III. Rev. Stat. 1981, ch. 95 1/2, par. 2-115) are in irreconcilable conflict with the provisions of the Human Rights Act (III. Rev. Stat. 1981, Ch. 68, par. 1-101 *et seq.*), and that the Human Rights Act is controlling.

The Supreme Court suggests that the General Assembly consider examining the conflict in Section 2-115 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 95 1/2, par. 2-115) and the provisions of the Human Rights Act (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 68, pars. 1-101 *et seq.*).

#### 2. THE COMPETING INTERESTS AND CONFLICTS BETWEEN THE CONTRIBUTION ACT AND THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT SHOULD BE STUDIED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The Supreme Court suggests that the General Assembly consider the Court's recent opinion in the case of <u>Kotecki v. Cyclops Welding Corp.</u> (April 18, 1991), No. 68568, <u>reh'g denied</u>, Dec. 2, 1991, slip op. at 8, with a view to resolving any conflicts between portions of the Workers' Compensation Act and the Joint Tortfeasor Contribution Act (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 48, pars. 138.5(a), (b), and 138.11; and ch. 70, par. 301 *et seq.*).

#### 3. SHOULD A FEDERAL DISTRICT COURT'S DISMISSAL OF A CAUSE OF ACTION ON THE BASIS OF IMPROP-ER VENUE BE GROUNDS UNDER THE SAVINGS STATUTE?

The Supreme Court in <u>DeClerck v. Simpson</u> (1991), 143 III. 2d 489, held that the savings statute (III. Rev. Stat. 1987, ch. 110, par. 13-217) (which extends the statute of limitations for causes of action dismissed on specified grounds) is inapplicable to a Federal district court's dismissal of a cause of action on the basis of improper venue. The majority opinion noted that whether or not it would be a good public policy to include a Federal district court's dismissal of a cause of action on the basis of improper venue as an additional savings statute condition is an issue to be considered by the legislature.

The Supreme Court suggests that the General Assembly study whether a Federal district court's dismissal of a cause of action on the basis of improper venue should be an additional savings statute condition.

#### 4. UNIFORM DIRECT REVIEW PROCEDURES IN AD-MINISTRATIVE ACTIONS.

In County of Cook v. Cermak Health Services v. Illinois Local Labor Relations Board (1991), 144 III. 2d 326, 334-35, the Supreme Court stated "that the legislature has the power under article VI, section 6, of the constitution to provide for direct appellate review of administrative actions. The use of such legislative authority must be explicitly stated, however, or when statutory requirements enacted pursuant to the legislature's constitutional power under article VI, section 6, are in conflict with this court's rules, our rules will control."

The Supreme Court urges the General Assembly to consider the Supreme Court's decision in <u>County of Cook</u> and to re-examine the direct review provisions of various Acts with a view toward providing uniform direct review procedures which correspond with Supreme Court Rule 335.

#### 5. SHOULD THE CONCEPT OF MARKET SHARE LIABIL-ITY BE AVAILABLE TO THE CITIZENS OF ILLINOIS?

The issue in <u>Smith v. Eli Lilly & Co.</u> (1990), 137 III. 2d 222, was whether Illinois should substitute for the element of causation, in fact, a theory of market share liability, when the identification of the manufacturer of the drug that injured the plaintiff is not possible.

The Supreme Court, in both the majority and dissenting in part opinions, held that the concept of market share liability is more suitable for consideration and thorough study by the General Assembly rather than one to be developed through litigation.

#### 6. "GANG-TRANSFER" PROVISION IN JUVENILE COURT ACT SHOULD BE CLARIFIED.

The legislature may want to examine the gang transfer provisions of the Juvenile Court Act. (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 37, par. 805-4(3.1).)

Our Court recently considered the guestion of the constitutionality of sections 5-4(3.1) of the Juvenile Court Act of 1987. That section, the so-called "gang-transfer" provision, permits the State's Attorney to file a petition/motion to prosecute a case under the criminal laws rather than under the Juvenile Court Act, if the petition/motion alleges (1) that the minor, age 15 years or older, committed a forcible felony, (2) that the minor had been previously adjudicated a delinquent for a felony, and (3) that the forcible felony "was committed in furtherance of criminal activity by an organized gang." (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 37, par. 805-4(3.1).) The section goes on to say that the juvenile court judge is "to hear and determine" the petition/motion, and "upon determining that (the) allegations are true, enter an order permitting (criminal) prosecution\*\*\*." III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 37, par. 805-4(3.1).

In <u>People v. P.H.</u> (1991), 145 III. 2d 209, our Court upheld the constitutionality of section 5-4(3.1). However, in doing so, the majority opinion rejected a double jeopardy challenge that the standard of proof at the "gang-transfer" hearing is beyond a reasonable doubt. While noting that the standard of proof at these hearings parallels that "in other (juvenile court) transfer proceedings," the Court's majority said that the "legislature has not yet spoken on what standard of proof is required for transfer under the 'gang-transfer' provision." (People v. P.H. (1991), 145 III. 2d 209, 225.) The specially concurring opinion, though, suggested that probable cause is the correct standard of proof under section 5-4(3.1). <u>People v. P.H.</u> (1991), 145 III. 2d 209, 237 (Miller, C.J., joined by Cunningham, J., specially concurring).

The Supreme Court urges the General Assembly to provide a standard of proof in section 5-4(3.1) of the Juvenile Court Act.

#### 7. "GOOD FAITH" AS IT APPEARS IN THE UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE SHOULD BE CLARIFIED AND PROVIDE FOR CONSISTENCY IN ITS CONCEPT.

In <u>Watseka First National Bank v. Ruda</u> (1990), 135 III. 2d 140, our Court noted the apparent deliberate exclusion of the duty to act in a commercially reasonable manner from Section 1-208 of the Uniform Commercial Code (III. Rev. Stat. 1987, ch. 26, par. 1-208).

The Supreme Court, therefore, recommends that the General Assembly consider amending section 1-208 of the Uniform Commercial Code (III. Rev. Stat. 1987, ch. 26, par. 1-208) to clarify and provide for consistency in the concept of "good faith" as it appears in the Uniform Commercial Code.

#### 8. SHOULD LEGAL SEPARATION AND DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE BE TREATED ALIKE IN REGARD TO JUDICIAL MODIFICATIONS OF AGREEMENTS?

Our court in <u>In re Marriage of Sutton</u> (1990), 136 III. 2d 441, held that Section 502(f) of the Marriage and Dissolution of Marriage Act dealing with the limits on modification of agreements under the Act (III. Rev. Stat. 1987, ch. 40, par. 502(f)) does not apply in cases of legal separation. A dissolution of marriage terminates the legal relationship between husband and wife by act of law, while a legal separation does not. The court noted that such explicit authority to limit modifications in dissolution does not, however, preclude judicial modification in relation to separation agreements.

The Supreme Court suggests that the General Assembly should consider whether legal separation and dissolution of marriage should be treated alike in regard to judicial modifications of agreements.

#### 9. THE CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE SHOULD PROVIDE THAT THE TIMELY FILING OF A DIRECT COMPLAINT WOULD EXTEND THE TIME PERIOD FOR FILING AN ACTION FOR CONTRIBUTION.

In <u>Hayes v. Mercy Hospital & Medical Center</u> (1990), 136 III. 2d 450, our Court ruled that an action for contribution must be filed within the four year time limit specified in section 13-212 of the Code of Civil Procedure (III. Rev. Stat. 1987, ch. 110, par. 13-212(a) ). The dissenting opinions (<u>Hayes v. Mercy Hospital & Medical Center</u> (1990), 136 III. 2d 450, 471 (Clark, J. dissenting), 473 (Calvo, J., joined by Ward and Clark, JJ., dissenting), believed that in this case such an interpretation denied a constitutional right for "certain remedy". Justice Clark, in his dissent, observes that the majority's opinion in interpreting the statute of repose effectively precludes contribution actions in medical malpractice cases where a party files the complaint on or near the last day of the repose statute. See also Pederson v. West (1990), 205 III. App. 3d 200. The Supreme Court invites the General Assembly to consider whether it is appropriate to amend the provisions of the Code of Civil Procedure regarding the time limit for filing contribution actions.

Section III. Additional Concerns suggested for consideration by the General Assembly.

#### 1. TRANSFER THE APPOINTMENT OF COMMIS-SIONERS OF THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS TO NON-JUDICIAL OFFICIALS.

The Supreme Court suggests that the General Assembly remove from the judiciary the function of the circuit court appointing commissioners to the Board of Election Commission in municipalities having such boards (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 46, par. 6-21) and place this function in some non-judicial body.

#### 2. THE ILLINOIS VEHICLE CODE AND ANY OTHER RELEVANT STATUTORY PROVISIONS SHOULD PRO-VIDE THAT LOCAL TRAFFIC ORDINANCE USE NUMBERING SYSTEMS PERMITTING THE MANUAL AND COMPUTER RECOGNITION OF COMPARABLE STATE LAW OFFENSES.

The circuit court clerks, and the Secretary of State in particular, report that there is wide disparity in local authorities' traffic ordinance numbering systems. As a consequence of this lack of uniformity, the clerks and Secretary of State have difficulty in discharging their statutory reporting and report-collection duties with regard to determining, by a mere examination of the traffic ticket which cites the local ordinance violated, the "comparability" of the local ordinance with offenses in the Illinois Vehicle Code. (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 95 1/2, par. 1-100 *et seq.* 

An example of a municipality adopting traffic ordinances which incorporate by reference the Illinois Vehicle Code numbering scheme can be found in <u>Village of</u> <u>Palatine v. Regard</u> (1990), 136 III. 2d 503, 505.

The Supreme Court suggests that the General Assembly study whether the appropriate provisions of the Illinois Vehicle Code and any other relevant statutory provisions should provide for local traffic ordinance use numbering systems permitting manual and computer recognition of comparable State law offenses.

#### 3. THE INSURANCE CODE SHOULD BE AMENDED TO ELIMINATE COURT APPROVAL OF COMPENSATION PAID FOR RECEIVERSHIP ADMINISTRATION.

Section 202 of the Illinois Insurance Code (III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 73, par. 814) provides that the Director of the Department of Insurance has the authority to appoint special deputies, attorneys, and other assistants to carry out duties regarding the dissolution of insurance companies. The same section also indicates that the director shall establish the compensation of all parties assisting him in these matters and that all such compensation shall be subject to the approval of the court.

It is inappropriate for a judge to approve compensation for services rendered outside of his knowledge, and about which he has little or no information. Without adequate information, it is difficult to make an informed judgment.

The Supreme Court recommends that the General Assembly change section 202 to provide that approval of compensation of parties assisting in the dissolution of insurance companies be made by an officer or State entity other than a judge.

#### 4. PROVIDING BY STATUTE THAT ALL DETERMINA-TIONS OF COMPETENCY TO STAND TRIAL BE MADE BY THE COURT.

Under present law, a defendant's fitness to stand trial must be determined initially by a judge or a jury. Either side may demand a jury prior to the commencement of the trial.

However, when the issue of fitness is raised after a trial has begun, or at the sentencing stage, the determination shall be made by the court. III. Rev. Stat. 1989, ch. 38, par. 104-12.

The right to have a jury trial in a hearing to determine fitness is based on statute. The Supreme Court stated in <u>People v. Brown</u> (1969), 43 III. 2d 79, that "(t)he right to trial by jury guaranteed by the sixth amendment to the Federal constitution and by section 5 of article II of our constitution does not extend to a hearing to determine the competency of a defendant to stand trial." (43 III. 2d at 81.) Cf. People v. Shadowens (1969), 44 III. 2d 70.

The General Assembly may want to provide by statute for all determinations of competence to be made by the court, because no constitutional rights have been found to be involved in the issue of fitness to stand trial.

# II THE APPELLATE COURT



# THE APPELLATE COURT

#### JURISDICTION AND ORGANIZATION

The Appellate Court is the intermediate court of review in the Illinois judicial system. Jurisdiction is conferred upon it by article VI, section 6 of the Constitution, which is included in Appendix A.

Generally, appeals from final judgments of a circuit court may be taken as a matter of right to the Appellate Court, except in cases appealable directly to the Supreme Court and except from judgments of acquittal in criminal cases. The Appellate Court may exercise original jurisdiction when necessary to the complete determination of any case on review, and it may also directly review administrative actions as provided by law.

Acting pursuant to article VI, section 6, the General Assembly has provided that "final orders or determinations" of the Pollution Control Board (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 111 1/2, par. 1041), "judgments" of the State Board of Elections concerning disclosure of campaign contributions and expenditures (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 46, par. 9-22), and final orders of the Illinois State Labor Relations Board, the Illinois Local Labor Relations Board and the Illinois Educational Labor Relations Board (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 48, pars. 1611, 1716), decisions from the Illinois Human Rights Commission (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 68, par. 8-111), any order or decision of the Illinois Commerce Commission (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 111 2/3, par. 10-201), final orders of the Illinois Gaming Board (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 120, par. 2417.1), and a certain initial license issuance by the Director of the Department of Nuclear Safety and in connection therewith certain determinations of the Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Facility Siting Commission (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 111 1/2, par. 241-18) may be appealed directly to the Appellate Court.

Article VI, section 5, of the 1970 Illinois Constitution provides the number of Appellate Judges to be selected from each judicial district shall be provided by law. A map of the judicial districts of the supreme and appellate courts is shown in Appendix D. The General Assembly has provided for the election of 18 Appellate Judges from the First District, six each from the Second, Third and Fifth Districts, and four from the Fourth District. Pursuant to article VI, section 10, Appellate Court judges, like Supreme Court judges, are elected for 10 year terms.

Article VI, section 5, also provides for the organization of the Appellate Court to be as prescribed by the Supreme Court by rule. The Supreme Court has adopted Rule 22 which establishes the organization of the Appellate Court. The rule (as amended effective November 20, 1991) provides as follows:

#### Rule 22. Appellate Court Organization

#### (a) Divisions — Appellate Districts.

(1) Each district of the Appellate Court shall consist of one division unless the Supreme Court provides otherwise by order. The First District shall sit in the city of Chicago. The Second District shall sit in the city of Elgin. The Third District shall sit in the city of Ottawa. The Fourth District shall sit in the city of Springfield. The Fifth District shall sit in the city of Mount Vernon. With the approval of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, a division may sit at any place in the state. The Appellate Court in each district shall be in session throughout the year, and each division shall sit periodically as its judicial business requires. Each division shall sit in panels of three judges as hereinafter provided.

(2) Oral arguments in the appellate court will normally be held in the courthouse provided for that purpose in the appropriate city designated in subparagraph (a)(1). However, with the approval of all the parties and the chief justice, a panel of the appellate court may, on occasion, agree to set an oral argument to be held in a suitable, alternative location but outside the courthouse in which the panel would otherwise normally preside.

#### (b) Assignment to Divisions — Designation of Panels.

The Supreme Court shall assign judges to the various divisions. The presiding judge of a division shall designate judges serving in that division to sit in panels of three. Such a three-judge panel shall constitute the division for purposes of rendering a decision in a case. The Executive Committee of the First District, upon request of a division of that district, may designate any Appellate Court judge of that district to sit in the place of a judge of the requesting division for such case or cases as may be designated in the request.

#### (c) Decisions.

Three judges must participate in the decision of every case, and the concurrence of two shall be necessary to a decision. One judge may decide motions of course.

#### (d) Divisions — Presiding Judge.

The judges of each division shall select one of their number to serve as presiding judge of that division for a term of one year.

#### (e) Executive Committee of the Appellate Court of Illinois.

The presiding judges of the Second, Third, Fourth, and Fifth Districts and the members of the Executive Committee of the First District shall constitute the Executive Committee of the Appellate Court of Illinois. Meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by any three of its members, and meetings of the Appellate Court may be called by the Executive Committee.

#### (f) Executive Committee of the Appellate Court in the First Appellate District.

There shall be an Executive Committee of the First District composed of one member of each division, which committee shall exercise general administrative authority. The Executive Committee shall select one of its number as chairman.

#### (g) Industrial Commission Appeals.

A five-judge panel of the Appellate Court will sit as the Industrial Commission Division of each district of the Appellate Court. The Industrial Commission division will hear and decide all appeals involving proceedings to review orders of the Industrial Commission. The division will sit, periodically, as its judicial business requires, at any place in the state it chooses. Five judges must participate in the decisions of the Industrial Commission division, and the concurrence of three shall be necessary to a decision. If a judge designated to serve on this panel cannot participate, the alternate designated by the Supreme Court shall participate. Motions, of course, may be decided by one judge.

#### **1991 APPELLATE COURT CASELOAD SUMMARY**

There were 8,297 total new filings in 1991 compared with 7,812 in 1990, an increase of 6%. Dispositions in 1991 amounted to 8,303 compared to 7,951 cases in 1990, an increase of 8.6%. There were 8,718 cases pending at the end of 1991 compared with 8,638 in 1990, an increase of 1%. 2,249 cases were disposed of with opinions in 1991, compared to 2,082 in 1990, an increase of 8.25%. During 1991, the Appellate Court Judges disposed of 3,350 cases by Rule 23 Order, compared with 3,126 in 1990, an increase of 8.3%. (All figures for the Appellate Court include Industrial Commission cases.)

#### ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE OF THE ILLINOIS APPELLATE COURT

The Administrative Committee of the Illinois Appellate Court, created by order of the Supreme Court, studies and recommends methods by which the Appellate Court might improve the processing of appeals. The Administrative Office serves as secretary to the Committee.

#### APPELLATE COURT CLERKS

Article VI, section 18(a) of the Illinois Constitution provides that the Appellate Court Judges of each Judicial District, respectively, shall appoint a clerk and other nonjudicial officers for their Court or District. The Appellate Court Clerk in the First District, Gilbert S. Marchman, in the Second District, Loren J. Strotz, in the Third District, Roger H. Johnson, in the Fourth District, Darryl Pratscher and, in the Fifth District, Louis E. Costa continue to serve their respective courts.

#### APPELLATE COURT RESEARCH DEPARTMENTS

Each appellate district has its own research department supervised by a director of research and staffed by such number of staff attorneys as the Supreme Court may from time to time determine. The research departments perform such duties as may be assigned to them by the Presiding Judge of the district or, in the First District, by the Executive Committee. They coordinate their activities, exchange information, and publish and maintain a manual of procedures for the research staff. The director of research and staff attorneys must be graduates of law schools approved by the American Bar Association.

#### SUPREME COURT ASSIGNMENT OF CIRCUIT JUDGES TO THE APPELLATE COURT

Article VI, sections 15 and 16 of the 1970 Illinois Constitution allows the Supreme Court to assign a retired judge, with his consent, to judicial service and to assign temporarily a sitting judge to any court, except that an associate judge may be assigned only as an associate judge. The circuit judges who sat on the Appellate Court during 1991, by assignment, are shown below. The date the judge's assignment commenced is shown in parenthesis.

# THE CIRCUIT COURTS

#### JURISDICTION AND ORGANIZATION

The trial level court of general jurisdiction in Illinois is known as the Circuit Court. It has original jurisdiction of all justiciable matters, except: (1) in matters relating to redistricting of the General Assembly and to the ability of the governor to serve or resume office; (2) where the Supreme Court exercises its discretionary original jurisdiction in cases relating to revenue, mandamus, prohibition or habeas corpus; and (3) by statute, the review of orders of certain State agencies. There are no courts of special or limited jurisdiction in Illinois. (III. Const. 1970, art, VI, sec. 9.) No judge of the Circuit Court has the power to review the decision of another and there are no trials *de novo*.

The State is divided into 22 judicial circuits by statute (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 37, par. 72.1). Three circuits, Cook County and the 12th and 18th Circuits, consist of a single county. The other 19 judicial circuits are composed of two or more contiguous counties as provided by law. Each judicial circuit has but one unified Circuit Court.

There are two categories of judges in the Circuit Courts: (1) circuit judges and (2) associate judges. All judges must be licensed attorneys. (III. Const. 1970, art. VI, sec. 11.) Circuit judges are initially elected, either on a circuit-wide basis or from the county where they reside. (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 37, pars. 72.2, 72.42-1.) They serve six year terms. (III. Const. 1970, art. VI, sec. 10.) In the Cook County Circuit, circuit judges are elected from the entire county or as resident judges from each of the 15 subcircuits within Cook County. (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 37, pars. 72.2f, 72.42.)

The circuit judges in each circuit select by secret ballot a chief judge from their number to serve at their pleasure. Subject to the authority of the Supreme Court, the chief judge has general administrative authority over his court. (III. Const. 1970, art. VI, sec. 7.)

Associate judges are appointed for four year terms by the circuit judges in their respective circuits. (III. Const. 1970, art. VI, sec. 8, 10.) Like circuit judges, associate judges may exercise the full constitutional jurisdiction of the Circuit Court. However, Article VI, section 8 of the Constitution directs the Supreme Court to provide by rule for matters to be assigned to associate judges. The Court discharges this responsibility through Supreme Court Rule 295, discussed below.

#### 1991 CIRCUIT COURT CASELOAD SUMMARY

The number of cases filed in the circuit courts in Illinois during 1991 was 2,321,638, compared with 2,178,628 in 1990, an increase of 6.2%. The number of cases disposed of in 1991 was 2,826,613 compared with 2,482,595 in 1990, an increase of 12.2%.

#### **1991 CONFERENCE OF CHIEF CIRCUIT JUDGES**

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 42, a Conference of Chief Circuit Judges meets regularly to consider problems relating to the administration of the circuit courts and such other matters as may, from time to time, be referred to the Conference by the Supreme Court. During calendar year 1991, the Honorable Benjamin K. Miller served as liaison from the Supreme Court. In accordance with Supreme Court Rule 42, the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts is the secretary to the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges. During 1991, the Conference met monthly, except in July.

\*During 1991, the Hon. Terrence J. Hopkins (Second Judicial Circuit), the Hon. Charles V. Romani (Third Judicial Circuit), the Hon. David K. Slocum (Eighth Judicial Circuit), the Hon. Stephen F. Evans (Ninth Judicial Circuit), the Hon. William T. Caisley (Eleventh Judicial Circuit), and the Hon. Herman S. Haase (Twelfth Judicial Circuit) also held office as chief circuit judges.

#### **OUT-OF-CIRCUIT ASSIGNMENTS**

Article VI, section 16, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that the Supreme Court may assign
a judge temporarily to any court and an associate judge to serve temporarily as an associate judge on any circuit court. During 1991, 78 circuit judges and 76 associate judges (for a total of 154 judges) from 14 downstate circuits were assigned by the Supreme Court to serve, temporarily, in the Circuit Court of Cook County. These assignments, made for weekly periods, totalled 351 judgeweeks of service. In the downstate circuits, on the request of the chief judges of 21 circuits, 52 circuit judges and 33 associate judges (for a total of 85 judges) from 19 circuits were assigned to serve, temporarily, outside their circuit to hear a total of 91 cases. These assignments were generally made due to the recusal of judges or for the judge presiding in a case to hear the matter in another circuit on a change of venue or change of place of trial.

\*A "judge week" is calculated by assessing the amount of work time required by a judge away from his/her home circuit. Therefore, in some cases, Cook County assignments of less than five working days are counted as a "judge week" because of the travel time required.

#### **RULE 295 ASSIGNMENTS**

Article VI, section 8, of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 authorizes the Supreme Court to "provide by rule for matters to be assigned to Associate Judges". In implementing this authority, the Supreme Court has provided in Rule 295 that an associate judge may hear any matter except the trial of criminal cases in which a defendant is charged with an offense punishable by imprisonment for more than one year. However, upon a showing of need, the Supreme Court may authorize the chief judge of a circuit to make temporary assignments of individual associate judges to conduct trials of those criminal cases.

In 1991, the Supreme Court, through its Administrative

Director, approved requests from the Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of Cook County to assign 165 individual associate judges to conduct trials of criminal cases in which the defendant may be punished by imprisonment for more than one year. The requests of the Chief Judge were for authorization to assign 128 judges for the period of the entire year. There were 14 requests to assign judges for a period of eight and a half months for each judge and 23 requests to assign a judge for a period of six months.

The Court also approved requests from 19 downstate chief judges for authorization to assign 155 individual associate judges to these criminal cases. The following is a summary of assignment requests and authorizations:

In terms of judicial manpower made available to preside at the trials of these criminal cases, the numbers of judgemonths provided by the above authorizations are 1,793 in Cook County and 1,567 in the downstate circuits.

# THE CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT

Pursuant to article VI, section 18(b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, the General Assembly shall provide by law for the election, or for the appointment by circuit judges, of clerks of the circuit courts and for their terms of office and removal for cause. Current law provides that one clerk of the circuit court shall be elected in each county for a term of four years.

In addition to performing the usual duties incumbent upon a clerk (*e.g.*, attending sessions of the court; preserving the files and papers thereof; making, keeping and preserving complete records of all the proceedings and determinations, etc.) circuit clerks receive and distribute to their respective county, to various local governmental entities and to various funds in the state treasury, millions of dollars, annually, in fees, fines, penalties, assessments, and surcharges. Clerks also receive and disburse each year thousands of payments ordered by the courts in matters of child support and maintenance while maintaining for the court complete and accurate records of those accounts.

Circuit clerks regularly provide information, statistical data, and other reports requested by the Supreme Court, and their respective courts, on the state of the dockets and the business transacted by the courts, as well as other matters pertinent to the efficient operation of the courts.

# THE JUDICIAL CONFERENCE

The Illinois Judicial Conference was created by the Supreme Court in 1953 in the interest of maintaining a well-informed judiciary active in improving the administration of justice. The Conference has met annually since 1954 and has the primary responsibility for the creation and supervision of the continuing judicial education effort in Illinois.

The Judicial Conference was incorporated into the 1964 Judicial Article and is now provided for in Article VI, Section 17 of the 1970 Constitution. According to Supreme Court Rule 41, the stated purpose of the Judicial Conference is to "consider the business and problems pertaining to the administration of justice in this state." Rule 41 implements Section 17 by establishing membership in the Conference, creating an Executive Committee to assist the Supreme Court in conducting the Conference, and appointing the Administrative Office as secretary of the Conference.

The membership of the Judicial Conference includes the Supreme Court Judges, appellate court judges, and all circuit judges. The Supreme Court appoints six judges from Cook County and six judges from outside Cook County to serve three year terms on the Executive Committee. One member of the Supreme Court serves as exofficio member of the Committee.

Conference-sponsored judicial education programs consist of an annual meeting for all circuit and appellate judges, an annual seminar for all associate judges, a number of regional seminars, and a seminar sponsored by the Illinois Supreme Court and organized by the Subcommittee on Judicial Education for all newly appointed or elected judges. Attendance at the Conference, the Associate Judges Seminar and the New Judge Seminar is mandatory. The Judicial Conference also sponsors study committee projects which result from the Supreme Court or Executive Committee identifying specific procedural or substantive concerns meriting special consideration by the judiciary. Many of the recommendations contained in the reports of the various study committees have been included in the Supreme Court's annual report of recommendations to the General Assembly which, in turn, have resulted in successful legislative efforts for improving the judicial/legal system.

The Executive Committee meets regularly to plan and supervise the organization of the Conference programs and the activities of the various Judicial Conference study committees. In addition, the Executive Committee considers recommendations relating to the improvement of the administration of justice which arise as a result of the Conference, seminars, and committee activities. Those recommendations, if approved, are submitted to the Supreme Court for its consideration. The following judges served on the Executive Committee in 1991:

In 1991, the Executive Committee selected the site, topics and faculty for the 1991 annual program of the Illinois Judicial Conference and it supervised the Associate Judge Seminar Coordinating Committee in planning the annual Associate Judge Seminar. The Committee monitored the work of the Subcommittee on Judicial Education in planning the remainder of the 1990-1991 Regional Seminar Series. The Executive Committee's commitment to judicial education was further reinforced by proposing a seminar for appellate judges. This proposal was approved and an Appellate Judges Seminar was held in June.

In addition to its work in judicial education, the Executive Committee monitored the work of the Study Committee on Complex Litigation, the Study Committee on Juvenile Justice, the Study Committee on the Operation of the Judicial System, and the work of the Committee on Legislation.

# 1991 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE ILLINOIS JUDICIAL CONFERENCE

The Illinois Judicial Conference held its thirty-eighth annual meeting on Wednesday through Friday, August 28-30, 1991 at the Marriott Hotel in Chicago. Four hundred and thirty-five circuit and reviewing court judges were present.

Judge Alexander T. Bower, Chair of the Executive Committee of the Judicial Conference, called the meeting to order. Chief Justice Benjamin K. Miller presented the state of the judiciary address at the opening day dinner session. Justice Charles E. Freeman presided at the Thursday luncheon honoring recently retired judges and introducing new judges.

During the three day program, the judges studied and discussed recent procedural and substantive developments in the law. Seven topics were offered including capital cases and civil motion practice, both of which were all day sessions. Other half day sessions covered were Civil Practice, Domestic Relations, Medical/Legal Issues, and Recent Developments in Evidence and Judicial Ethics. Each judge attended four sessions, one of which was a mandatory ethics presentation. All programs and reading materials were prepared by members of the judiciary and professors from Illinois law schools.

#### ASSOCIATE JUDGE SEMINAR

The Associate Judge Seminar was presented at the Marriott Hotel in Chicago, Wednesday through Friday, March 13-15, 1991. Thirteen topics were presented during the two and one-half day seminar. Judge James J. Wimbiscus, Chair of the Coordinating Committee presided over the opening session and Judge John Davis addressed the attendees. Judge Michael J. Murphy, Vice-Chair, moderated the program honoring retired, deceased, and new associate judges. Judge Mary Ann McMorrow, appellate judge in the first district, delivered the luncheon address "The Job of Judging, the Art of Judging, and the Human Dimension in Judging."

A plenary ethics session focusing on the role of ethics in society, law, government, and business followed the opening address. There were eight one hour presentations which focused on "hot topics" such as orders of protection, setting up a high volume call, or occult and ritualistic behavior. Each attendee elected to attend two of the "hot topics" sessions. The other four topics were two and one half hour presentations which dealt with trial practice issues and juvenile law. Each attendee elected to attend three of these four sessions.

#### APPELLATE JUDGES SEMINAR

A two-day seminar was presented for all appellate judges in June, 1991. The topic "Appellate Court Operational Review" was tailored to respond to questions raised by the participants. The purpose of the session was to review the various administrative procedures of the appellate court and to share techniques and methodologies which had contributed to successful operations.

"Judicial Writing" offered a concentrated treatment of the basic rules of good English composition as applied to legal writing. The objective was to enable the participants to write more clearly, more persuasively and more quickly. Additionally, because the judicial writer often oversees the writing of others such as clerks, a portion of the program focused on how to manage the writing of others.

Faculty for presentation of Appellate Court Operational Review was the Hon. Allen Hartman, Appellate Court Judge of the First Appellate District and the Hon. Philip G. Reinhard, Appellate Court Judge of the Second Appellate District. Presenting Judicial Writing was Professor Joseph M. Williams, Department of English, the University of Chicago.

#### **NEW JUDGE SEMINAR**

The Subcommittee on Judicial Education organized and presented the annual four and one-half day New Judge Seminar in early January, 1991. The entire program was conducted by experienced judicial faculty. New judges were informed about the organization and operation of the Judicial Conference and the Administrative Office. Topics of most concern to new judges included Rules of the Illinois Supreme Court, judicial ethics and conduct, motion practice, trial practice, setting bonds, search and seizure, criminal law, handling DUI cases, judgments, enforcements and orders, and coping with volume.

#### **REGIONAL SEMINAR SERIES**

Three topics were presented at the 1991 annual regional seminars which are available to all Illinois judges usually from October through May. Unlike the Judicial Conference, the Associate Judges Seminar, and the New Judges Seminar, attendance at regional seminars is not mandatory.

Programs for the seminars were selected, planned and monitored by the Subcommittee on Education and approved by the Executive Committee and the Supreme Court. The two-day seminar "Children and the Law" emphasized the interrelationship between a child's interest and the areas of custody and visitation, evidence, juvenile law, criminal law, tort law, adoption and paternity.

# THE COURTS COMMISSION

The Judicial Inquiry Board, composed of lay persons, lawyers, and judges, conducts investigations against judges, files formal voted complaints against judges with the Courts Commission, and prosecutes those complaints before the Commission. The five judges who comprise the Commission hear those complaints, make findings, and enter dispositive orders of dismissal or impose sanctions. The Commission consists of one Supreme Court Justice selected by the Court, who serves as chairman of the Commission, two Appellate Court Judges selected by that Court, and two Circuit Judges selected by the Supreme Court. The Commission is empowered to remove from office, suspend without pay, censure or reprimand a Judge for willful misconduct in office and to suspend, with or without pay, or retire a judge who is physically or mentally unable to perform his or her duties. Pursuant to Rule 2 of the Courts Commission, the Administrative Director is the Commission secretary.

# **OPINIONS OF THE COURTS COMMISSION DURING 1991**

Summaries of the decisions of the Illinois Courts Commission rendered in 1991 are as follows: (1) Complaint 90 CC 1 charged an associate judge of the Seventh Judicial Circuit, in a one-count complaint, with conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice and that brings the judicial office into disrepute in that he, during the early morning hours of August 4, 1989, was observed asleep in a car in front of a tavern and shortly thereafter, while driving the car, was stopped by a deputy sheriff for improper lane usage; that respondent had been drinking alcohol and was under its influence when he was stopped; and that the respondent failed to cooperate with the deputy sheriff when asked to exit his car and submit to a field sobriety or breathalyzer test. The complaint alleged that the respondent violated Supreme Court Rules 61 and 62(A).

On October 30, 1991 respondent was reprimanded by the Commission. In determining the sanction to be imposed, the Commission took into account as a mitigating circumstance the fact that the respondent underwent an alcohol remedial education program.

(2) Complaint 90 CC 2 charged a Cook County circuit judge, in a seven-count complaint, with willful misconduct in office and conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice in that he, during his 1990 primary election campaign for the Democratic nomination for judge of the First District Appellate Court, authorized and approved certain campaign advertisements which were published in Chicago and Chicago-area newspapers and said advertisements were "inaccurate, misleading, and cast doubt upon his capacity to decide impartially issues that may come before him" (copies of the advertisements were attached as exhibits to the complaint and, in general, stated that the judge is "tough on crime and taxes", citing examples of how he, as a judge, was "tough on crime and taxes" and "highly qualified"); and that he failed to properly oversee his campaign finances by not establishing a responsible campaign committee, by issuing checks for campaign expenses from his personal account, and by engaging in conduct to avoid the Illinois campaign disclosure laws. The complaint alleged that the respondent violated Supreme Court Rules 61, 62(A), 67(A)(4), 67(B)(1)(a) and (c), and 67(B)(2).

On October 25, 1991, the Commission found evidence presented by the Board sufficient to prove in three counts and reprimanded the respondent for his violations of the Code of Judicial Conduct.

# THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE ILLINOIS COURTS

### **Tribute to Retired Employees**

Special gratitude is extended to W. Dale Rapp and Jerry B. Gott, both of whom retired effective 12/31/91. The combined dedicated service of both gentlemen exceeds 46 years.

As Mail/Reprographics Supervisor, Dale Rapp's tenure began on January 1, 1966. For many years, he managed the workload single-handedly until growth of the Administrative Office necessitated the hiring of three additional employees placed under his supervision to also handle messenger service, mailings, and office supplies.

Prior to coming to the Administrative Office, Jerry B. Gott was Clerk of the Circuit Court of Jefferson County in the Second Judicial Circuit from December 1, 1952 until August 31, 1969. He brought a wealth of information to his new position with the Administrative Office on September 1, 1969. As Associate Director, Circuit Clerk Liaison, Mr. Gott was instrumental in implementing the Supreme Court Administrative Order on Recordkeeping in the circuit courts. In addition to serving many years on the Article V Ad Hoc Committee of the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges and assuming primary responsibility for revising the Uniform Traffic Ticket, Mr. Gott regularly provided staff assistance to the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges. During his tenure, he was the primary source of information relating to judicial vacancies and elections.

The Administrative Office expresses its deepest appreciation to Dale and Jerry for their many years of dedicated service.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts is established by the Illinois Constitution of 1970 to assist the Chief Justice in fulfilling administrative and supervisory duties. Primary responsibilities of the Office include preparing the State Judicial System budget, maintaining records and statistics on case loads and case flow in the Unified Court System, organizing all payrolls for judicial personnel and court reporters, serving as secretary to various committees and other organizations, managing court facilities and equipment, and providing continuing education for judges.

The Office is also charged with administering a number of Supreme Court Rules. Rule 21(d) requires the office to maintain filed copies of Appellate Court and Circuit Court rules. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 68, the Administrative Director is the custodian of verified statements of economic interest which are filed by Illinois judges for the years prior to April 30, 1987. Sealed statements filed under this rule may be opened only by the Supreme Court or by the Illinois Courts Commission when specifically authorized by the Supreme Court for use in proceedings of the Commission. Parties to an action may request from the Administrative Director information from unsealed lists concerning businesses in which a judge or members of his or her immediate family have a financial interest.

The Administrative Director and his staff appear before the appropriation committees of the General Assembly to testify concerning the State judicial budget, and they are frequently called upon to advise the judiciary committees on proposed legislation affecting the courts. They also address civic groups, bar associations, legislative commissions and court reform groups concerning court administration and the structure and operation of Illinois' unified court system.

Citizens, judges, lawyers, court administrators from other states, and persons from foreign nations visit the Administrative Office and the Illinois courts. One task of the Administrative Office is to explain the Illinois court system to them and arrange visits to courthouses and with judges. The office can also arrange for Illinois judges to visit the State's penal institutions in order to foster a greater understanding of the correctional system.

The Administrative Office is headed by a Director assisted by a Deputy Director, both of whom are appointed by the Supreme Court. Responsibilities of the Administrative Office are carried out through six divisions — Administrative Services, Court Services, Judicial Branch Education, Judicial Management Information Services (JMIS), Legal Services, and the Probation Services — each of which is headed by an Assistant Director.

More than 125 employees serve the Supreme Court and supervise the activities of all the courts in the State, including court-related personnel. Specific duties of each division and reports from each of the divisions summarizing their workload during the calendar year 1991 are discussed in greater detail herein.

# ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR JOSEPH F. CUNNINGHAM APPOINTED TO SUPREME COURT

On June 17, 1991, Hon. Joseph F. Cunningham, who had served as Director of the Administrative Office since July 15, 1990, was appointed to the Supreme Court to fill the vacancy created by the death of Justice Horace Calvo. Judge Cunningham had been a judicial officer from 1965 to 1988, including many years as chief judge of the 20th Circuit and, from September 16, 1987 to December 4, 1988, as a justice on the Supreme Court.

# WILLIAM M. MADDEN APPOINTED ACTING DIRECTOR

Effective June 17, 1991, William M. Madden was appointed Acting Director of the Administrative Office. Mr. Madden has served as Deputy Director since 1969.

#### EXECUTIVE OFFICE

The Supreme Court of Illinois acts not only as the final forum to resolve judicial disputes, but also as the administrator of the State's judicial system. The Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts, headed by the Administrative Director, serves at the pleasure of the Supreme Court to assist in the daily operations of the Judicial Branch. At the nucleus of the Administrative Office is the Executive Office, composed primarily of the Administrative Director and the Deputy Director.

The Director has responsibility for a variety of administrative duties delegated by the Supreme Court. He prepares administrative materials for the Supreme Court's review. The Director also acts as a teller of judicial elections by compiling and tabulating votes to fill associate judge vacancies by an elective process among the circuit judges. Pursuant to rule of the Courts Commission, the Director is the Commission Secretary. The Executive Office staff compiles and maintains biographies on all Illinois judges for the use of the Supreme Court.

In addition, the Director oversees and continually apprises the Supreme Court of the varied activities performed by the staff of the Administrative Office. These specific programs are identified within the divisional synopses in this report.

The Deputy Director is second in command of the Administrative Office and, in the Director's absence, assumes control of the office on behalf of the Director. The Director keeps the Deputy Director fully informed regarding matters in which the Administrative Office is involved and seeks his counsel on most matters before taking action or making recommendations to the Court. The Deputy Director represents the Administrative Office in any situation in which the Administrative Director is unable to do so. While each Assistant Director in each division sets the work goals for employees in his or her division, the Deputy Director is responsible for the dayto-day operations of the Chicago office, regardless of the specific division to which any individual is assigned. The Deputy Director serves as Secretary to the Supreme Court Rules Committee and the Supreme Court's Ad Hoc Committee on Civil Discovery Procedures.

# THE ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIVISION

The Administrative Services Division provides general administrative support to the judicial branch of government. The division is divided into the following areas: finance, personnel, labor relations, and intergovernmental relations.

# Finance

The finance unit is responsible for voucher processing; maintenance of accounting records; procurement of commodities, printing and equipment; inventory control over state-owned property; reproduction of materials for seminars; and performing audits of reimbursements paid to counties for probation services.

#### Personnel

The personnel unit processes semi-monthly and monthly payroll for judges and state-funded employees of the judicial branch. In conjunction with the payroll, the unit also administers a compensation plan which covers most of the employees of the judicial branch and serves as a liaison with other state agencies for issues pertaining to health insurance, deferred compensation, and retirement benefits.

#### Labor Relations

Labor relations services are provided to chief judges, circuit clerks, and other judicial branch managers in the following areas: "at-will" employment, retaliatory discharge, union-management relations, unlawful employment discrimination, and constitutionally based employment claims.

By the end of 1991, cases involving labor and employment matters were litigated by the Attorney General's Office, whereas, previously they had been litigated by an attorney on the labor relations staff.

### **Intergovernmental Relations Unit**

The Intergovernmental Relations Unit works closely with the Director and the operating divisions within the Administrative Office on matters which involve the Legislative and Executive Branches of State government. The unit acts as a legislative clearinghouse to provide information and legislative updates to the Supreme Court, the Administrative Office and the judges of the State. Additionally, the unit staffs the Supreme Court Committee on Legislation.

The intergovernmental Relations Unit assists the Director in communicating the budgetary needs and legislative positions of the Supreme Court to the Legislative and Executive Branches through meetings with legislators and their staff and testimony at committee hearings. The Legal Division of the Administrative Office complements this role by preparing bill analyses and answering technical and legal questions concerning bills introduced in the General Assembly. The unit also provides an understanding of the actions and focus of the General Assembly and other parts of State government to members of the Judicial Branch and identifies possible areas of support for or resistance to Supreme Court legislative initiatives. In cooperation with the Legal Division, the unit assists in preparing a draft of the Annual Report of the Supreme Court to the General Assembly. The Supreme Court reviews the draft and gives approval to the final language of this constitutionally mandated report.

#### COURT SERVICES DIVISION

The Court Services Division was established to assist the trial and appellate court operations in Illinois. Program areas of the division include circuit clerk services, statistical reporting, mandatory arbitration, court reporting management, child support, judicial committee support, victim services, jury management, records management, automated disposition reporting, court security and record keeping manuals.

#### **Automated Disposition Reporting**

The Automated Disposition Reporting (ADR) program is an automated process for circuit clerks to report court dispositions through the AOIC to the Secretary of State and the Department of State Police on magnetic computer tape in lieu of paper. Due to statutory changes, AOIC'S ADR processing, record layouts, and programming must undergo a complete rewrite in 1992. To facilitate the rewrite and to address other possible ADR court case reporting services, the Court Services Division is assuming an increasingly active role in project management, liaison activities and user support in this joint effort with the Judicial Management Information Services Division (JMIS). The system redesign was completed during November, 1991 and programming was started December 1, 1991.

In conjunction with the ADR Program, Court Services maintains the Offense Code Table (OFT). The OFT is updated annually and functions as an integral part of the ADR program. Plans for a 1992 rewrite of the OFT include sequential code assignment, semi-annual table updates, Secretary of State Indicator updates, and planning for OFT code removal procedures. Future efforts may include acceptance of approximately 50 additional counties, which use software developed by private vendors, into the ADR process.

Assisting the AOIC in the rewrite of the ADR program is the Automated Disposition User's Group. This group is composed of circuit clerks and their staff performing the collection of the dispositions at the county level and preparing them for processing by the AOIC program. This group has formed two subcommittees, the Data Dictionary Subcommittee and the Offense Code Table Subcommittee. The Court Services Division is working with both subcommittees. The Data Dictionary Subcommittee is assisting in the rewrite of the AOIC Data Dictionary which is planned for completion in early 1992. The Offense Code Table Subcommittee is working on a plan for improving the OFT maintained by the AOIC. That Subcommittee's tasks will continue through 1992.

#### **Child Support**

The Court Services Division staff provides support to the Conference of Chief Judges' Child Support Advisory Committee and their Subcommittee on Automation Linkage. Negotiations with the Illinois Department of Public Aid (IDPA) regarding a statewide child support automation system for the State of Illinois continued throughout the year. Site visits, written and telephone surveys, and meetings with the Committee, IDPA, and IBM representatives were held to gather information to begin the development of this new system.

Court Services staff also provided support to the counties that are participating in the Supreme Court Rule 296 child support enforcement program. The counties currently operating under the Rule include DeWitt, Douglas, Piatt, and Wayne. The most in-depth information from the report came from Piatt County, which was in the process of implementing a PC based Rule 296 system. The final evaluation of the PC based system in Piatt County was scheduled for release in 1992.

The Child Support Advisory Committee also participated in discussions regarding modifications to the Illinois Child Support Guidelines with various interested groups in Illinois. In cooperation with IDPA, Committee representatives were also active in finalizing details for the Expedited Child Support Process. It was determined that Cook County would serve as the Pilot site for the Expedited Process.

#### **Circuit Clerk Services**

The circut clerk services unit maintains ongoing communications with all circuit court clerks throughout IIlinois, responds to inquiries regarding new legislation, records retention policies, recordkeeping procedures and overall circuit clerk operations. This unit also works with the Secretary of State's office, the Illinois State Police, the Department of Conservation Law Enforcement and other agencies of state government concerning State level policies and procedures affecting circuit clerk operations. The staff met with most, if not all, of the circuit court clerks at their offices, and at annual meetings and zone meetings during 1991. In addition to meeting with the clerks, the unit is in frequent communication with the clerks by telephone, responding to questions and following legislation affecting clerks' operations. Additionally, the unit assisted the Judicial Education Division with three seminars for circuit clerks and their staff on Retention and Destruction of Court Records.

In conjunction with the Judicial Management Information Services (JMIS) Division, Court Services maintains the Automated Disposition Reporting (ADR) program and the Offense Code Table (OFT), which is an intimate part of the ADR program (see section on ADR above). In addition, the staff assisted the Director in preparing administrative agenda items relating to judicial vacancies and requests for additional associate judges, served on subcommittees of the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges Ad Hoc Committee on Article V Rules developing recommended changes to the Uniform Citation and Complaint Form and regulations governing issuance of bond certificates. Unit staff monitored sessions to the General Assembly for legislative initiatives affecting clerks and courts, and processed monthly Notice of Clerk's Intention to Destroy Records requests.

#### **Court Reporting Management**

Activities related to the management of official court reporters performed by and through the Court Services Division include court reporter proficiency testing and certification; continuing liaison with official reporters and their representatives; collection and monitoring of information pertaining to transcript income; evaluation of various court reporting technologies; and assistance in the development and administration of court reporter training. Division staff also investigated ways to enhance the productivity of court reporting services and to reduce costs associated with court reporting.

During 1991, six official court reporter proficiency examinations were offered; three in Chicago and three in East Peoria, Illinois. Proficiency testing is required by law. Several times each year the Administrative Office administers examinations to test the proficiency of persons interested in becoming official court reporters, and of incumbent official reporters who wish to attain a higher proficiency rating.

The Administrative Office also administered two computer proficiency examinations for official court reporters, both held in Chicago. These examinations allow incumbent official reporters to demonstrate their proficiency in using computer-aided transcription (CAT). Those who pass the examination are eligible to receive a higher rate of compensation as "computer proficient" court reporters.

Also in 1991, staff of the Court Services Division assisted the Judicial Branch Education Division in planning and conducting three regional seminars for official court reporters. A combined total of 244 official reporters attended seminars held in Mt. Vernon, Peoria and Chicago. Among the topics presented were: writing concepts for computer-aided transcription; personal computer applications; English language usage in transcription; and stress reduction.

#### **Court Security Program**

The court security program, established in January of 1988, continues to provide security information and planning assistance to the appellate and trial courts. The on-going roles of the Court Services Division include: (1) conducting physical security analyses of court facilities and providing technical assistance; (2) written security technical assistance reports containing site visit findings, problem analyses and recommendations; (3) preparing and presenting information to county boards to secure funding for report recommendations; and, (4) liaison to county, state and federal law enforcement agencies.

Throughout the year the Court Services Division staff provides support for the Court Security Standards Committee of the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges. The first half of a project on the existing level of court security within the Illinois court system was completed in May of 1991. The report, entitled "Status of Court Security in the State of Illinois" was published and distributed to the Conference of Chief Judges.

# **Judicial Commitee Support**

The Court Services Division provides staff support involving the preparation of meeting agendas, minutes, and reference materials, follow-up correspondence documenting committee action, drafting and conducting surveys and producing subsequent reports, and drafting proposed guidelines and standards in various court areas. This support is provided to the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges and its various subcommittees; the Illinois Judicial Conference Study Committee on the Operation of the Judicial System, the Supreme Court Study Committee on Mediation of Child Custody, Support and Visitation Disputes, and the Supreme Court Alternative Dispute Resolution Coordinating Committee.

# **Jury Management**

The Court Services Division also works to coordinate and improve jury management in the Circuit Courts of Illinois. In accordance with law, AOIC provides counties with merged source lists for jury selection upon request. During 1991, merged jury source lists were provided to 84 counties. In addition, Division staff coordinated the printing and distribution of approximately 113,000 handbooks for petit and grand jurors in the circuit courts.

# Mandatory Court-Annexed Arbitration Program

The Supreme Court's efforts to devise a high quality court-annexed arbitration system have spanned nearly the entire decade of the 1980's, and the public officials representing all branches of Illinois government as well as the general public have been consulted in the design process. With the support of the General Assembly and the Governor, the Illinois Supreme Court has devised and implemented a mandatory court-annexed arbitration system for selected circuit courts. Arbitration was operational in 1991 in the circuit courts of Winnebago, DuPage, Lake and Cook counties. Late in 1990 the Supreme Court approved McHenry County for arbitration. Arbitration hearings began in McHenry County in April of 1991. Expansion of the program in the future will occur with Supreme Court approval in the areas of the State where there is a demonstrable need, provided sufficient public funding is available to support expansion efforts.

In 1991, each county began the year with an inventory of arbitration eligible cases not terminated in the previous year. Winnebago County began the year with 419 pending cases, 1,258 cases were added, 1,171 cases were processed and removed from the arbitration calendar, leaving 506 cases pending at the end of the year. In DuPage County, 1,502 cases were pending at the start of the year, 4,290 cases were added, 4,424 cases were processed and removed, leaving 1,366 cases pending at the end of the year. Lake County began the year with 495 pending cases, 2,590 cases were added, 2,463 cases were processed and removed, leaving 622 cass pending at the close of the year. The Circuit Court of Cook County began the year with 5,064 cases pending, 9,356 cases previously pending in that court's law division were transferred to arbitration and subsequently set for hearing. Of the cases set for hearing, 10,934 cases were processed and removed from the arbitration calendar, leaving 3,666 cases pending at the end of 1991. In McHenry County's first nine months of operation 681 new cases, 133 pending cases and 24 reinstated cases were assigned arbitration hearing dates.

A commonly cited measure of performance in courtannexed arbitration programs is the extent to which awards are accepted by the litigants as the final resolution of the case. In Winnebago and Lake counties, 29.6% and 32.5%, respectively, of the arbitration awards rendered in 1991 were rejected. In DuPage County, this number was 32.1%. In the Circuit Court of Cook County, rejections were filed in 38.9% of the cases receiving a hearing.

Even more telling than the rejection rate is the frequency with which cases heard in arbitration must later be tried in the circuit court. Only a small number of arbitration-eligible cases actually go to trial after arbitration even though awards in an appreciable number of cases may have been rejected. In Lake and Winnebago counties, 16% of the total cases heard in arbitration went on to trial in the circuit court. In DuPage County, 12% of the total cases heard in arbitration went on to trial in the circuit court. Trial data was unavailable from the Circuit Court of Cook County.

The case management capabilities offered by mandatory court-annexed arbitration are as important as the cost saving potential for courts and litigants. Because cases must be set for hearing within one year from the date of filing, careful attention must be paid to the age of pending lawsuits in order to identify those matters whose unique circumstances may contribute to a delay in processing at any of the various stages of the arbitration process. In some instances, delay from filing to hearing to final disposition is unavoidable and even necessary to insure fairness if a particular lawsuit is unusually complicated. Nevertheless, the arbitration process is structured to monitor caseflow so that standard time elapsed from filing to termination is met for all but the extraordinary minority of eligible cases. Activity reported by the circuit courts of Lake, DuPage and Winnebago Counties indicates that cases are indeed proceeding to hearing and ultimately to final disposition in a deliberate and timely manner.

In December of 1991, Sangamon State University's Center for Legal Studies completed its 2 year comprehensive evaluation of the Lake County Arbitration Program. This research project was designed to assess the effectiveness of arbitration as an alternative means of resolving disputes by comparing the performance of a sample of civil cases previously processed in the traditional fashion with performance measures for a sample of similar cases filed after arbitration was instituted in the circuit court.

Overall, the SSU study concluded from the reported data that the Lake County circuit court arbitration program achieved its goals of improving the pace of civil case dispositions while maintaining high standards of quality and justice for users of the arbitration system. The Lake County circuit court effectively implemented and managed the arbitration program in a manner consistent with Supreme Court Rules and statutory requirements, creating what the Sangamon State University research team described as "a model of efficiency and effectiveness to be replicated in other counties in Illinois and other states."

#### **Records Management**

Records Management staff conducted a study of record storage in the Third District Appellate Court Clerk's office, with particular emphasis on closed cases. Similar studies were completed in the circuit clerks' offices in Fulton, Jefferson, Knox, and LaSalle Counties. Each study resulted in a report to the clerk describing such options as purging, microfilming, and off-site storage in terms of cost and benefit. Staff also made an inventory of the various AOIC records stored in Springfield. In addition to giving specific information to clerks, these projects provided an opportunity for AOIC staff to review the various recordkeeping policies of the Manual on Recordkeeping.

#### **Statistical Reporting**

Maintenance of an accurate and timely statistical reporting system is one of the primary responsibilities of the Court Services Division. Staff responsible for this critical function compile, post and analyze caseload and financial information provided by the clerks of the Illinois courts. This information, which is set forth in this annual report, is available for general reference, research purposes and related court improvement efforts. Recent efforts to improve the statistical reporting system have included revisions to selected data collection forms, review of statistical report submissions to ensure the integrity of information and necessary follow-up contact with the clerks of the courts.

#### Victims' Services

The principal focus of this unit is in the area of family violence. Highlights of the year included the following: (1) providing technical assistance to the Abuse and Empowerment Subcommittee of the Supreme Court Mediation Study Committee; (2) providing technical assistance for the 9th Judicial Circuit in development of a multisystem family violence advisory council; (3) serving on an advisory committee to the Domestic Violence Project of the Rural Justice Center; (4) serving on the Domestic Violence Advisory Council to the Director of the Illinois Department of Public Aid; and (5) serving on the Illinois Attorney General's Task Force on Domestic Violence.

# JUDICIAL BRANCH EDUCATION DIVISION

The Division has responsibility for providing training programs for judges, probation personnel, administration and technical personnel, circuit clerks and court reporters.

# Judicial Training and Continuing Professional Education

Another important function of the Judicial Branch Education Division is to provide staff support to the Illinois Judicial Conference in the administration of education programs. Judicial Education staff serve the Executive Committee of the Judicial Conference, the Subcommittee on Judicial Education, the Associate Judge Seminar Coordinating Committee, and the various topical committees established to develop the judicial program topics and format. A description of the Illinois Judicial Conference work appears in the Judicial Conference chapter of this report.

#### **Court Administration and Technical Training**

During 1991, the Division staff developed and presented seminars in specialized areas pertaining to the specific job responsibilities of circuit clerks, court reporters, and trial court administrators.

Two seminars were offered to circuit clerks. Each allday seminar was presented three times at various locations around the State. "Responsibilities for Retention and Destruction of Court Records" featured topics on (1) Court Record Microfilming; (2) Administrative Order on Recordkeeping; (3) Manual on Recordkeeping in the Circuit Court of Illinois; (4) Storage of Paper Documents; and (5) the Illinois Regional Archives Depository System (IRAD). The second seminar featured "Statistical and Disposition Reporting Issues". Topics included (1) Statistical Reporting to the Administrative Office; (2) Traffic Case Disposition Reporting to the Office of the Secretary of State; (3)Traffic Case Disposition Reporting to the Illinois State Police; (4)Criminal Case Disposition Reporting to the Illinois State Police; and, (5) Discussion of Issues Related to Automated Dispositon Reporting.

The team concept approach was utilized in the circuits in presenting the seminar entitled "Planning and Implementing Enhanced Case Management Systems for Civil and Criminal Cases". The program was offered to all twenty-two judicial circuits to the chief judge or presiding judge and his or her administrative assistant or trial court administrator. As a team, the judge and his or her administrative assistant worked toward resolving specific issues designed to enhance case managemnent. Each team was given five assignments which consisted of (1) Analyzing the existing civil or criminal system in their circuit; (2) Reporting System Analyses (groups of three court teams report to each other); (3) Setting goals for new systems and reporting to plenary session; (4) Designing new system to meet goals; and (5) Reporting plans to their small groups to receive feedback and suggestions.

The team concept method was also employed in "Personnel/Human Resources Management in Illinois Courts". This seminar was offered to the chief judge of each circuit and his or her administrative assistant who handles personnel matters wihtin the circuit. Topics focused on the overview of the components of an effective personnel/human resources system, legal issues in personnel/human resources, compensation and reward systems, and recordkeeping and documentation.

A one-day workshop, designed to enhance transcript production, was presented in three locations around the State for court reporters. Other topics for the workshop included understanding body mechanics and how to reduce stress and avoid injury.

# JUDICIAL MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SERVICES

#### **Summary of Services**

The services of the Judicial Management Information Services Division (JMIS) to the Illinois courts and support units are as follows:

 Provide consultation in systems, networking, word processing, office automation, and personal computer usage including:

> Automation planning Requirements definition Computer procurement System evaluation System selection Personal computer hardware and software maintenance Personal computer hardware and software user training Local area and wide area networking Information clearinghouse.

- Procure and install microcomputers and related equipment, software, and communications in response to user needs.
- Develop, install, train users, and maintain application systems for specific courts and administrative units.
- Maintain and enhance system software capabilities to ensure full functionality of computers.
- Ensure efficient and modern communications between computers in courts throughout state and JMIS computers in Springfield and Chicago.
- Integrate above computer and communications technologies to ensure efficient, non-redundant automation statewide.
- Operate JMIS computers in Springfield and assist in operation of Chicago computer.
- Coordinate and assist with committees relating to court automation.

#### Summary of Activity

Separate case processing systems support the Supreme Court and Appellate Court, and during 1991, a new system is being developed for the Appellate Court. Both current systems run on IBM 4300 computers at the Administrative Office in Springfield (Supreme Court and downstate Appellate Court districts) and Appellate Court First District. Personal computers are used extensively in both courts for word processing, to access the IBM computers, to access legal reference services, for an increasing number of mirocomputer database applications in the clerks and judges offices, and to send filed Appellate Court opinions to the Reporter of Decisions from the downstate districts.

In 1991, a new project to develop an Appellate Court Information System was initiated. During the year, additional staff were hired, a number of productive meetings were held with representatives from the Appellate Districts, and the tools and techniques that were previously implemented were fully assimilated into the system design. By the end of the year, the combination of court personnel and JMIS representatives had fully defined the system requirements and had completed the overall design. The new system is intended to combine new concepts with new technology to assist the users in meeting the demands for increased productivity, functionality, and information availability.

Circuit court autonomy has resulted in the use of different types of computers and systems around the state. In addition to systems built in-house by specific courts, there are several software products from commercial vendors in use (*i.e.*, systems known as JIMS, GAVEL, and SUS-TAIN). These systems run on a range of computers from personal computers through midrange computers. Additional systems exist to address functions such as probation, jury management, and child support. Principal efforts in the circuit courts center around support of circuit-wide local area network sites in the Ninth Judicial Circuit, assisting sites in LaSalle and McHenry counties with supporting JURY+jury management software and hardware, the merging of voter and driver registration lists as a basis for jury selection in each county, and helping Sangamon County develop a long range automation plan.

Currently, the circuit courts in eight counties (Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry, Peoria, Sangamon, and St. Clair) submit traffic disposition data on magnetic tape to the Administrative Office for processing and submission to the Secretary of State and State Police. During 1991, a project to redesign and develop the ADR system was initiated. This project will replace the old and difficult to maintain system with a new system that will be much more responsive to changes in the external environment, will facilitate data base changes, and will provide a solid basis for the future. The system was also used to develop new design and development procedures in parallel with the new data base and programming technology being installed. By the end of the year, most of this system was developed and ready for full-scale testing. This new system will be implemented in the second quarter of 1992.

In the Administrative Office, a new system is being created to support payroll and property management. The analysis and preliminary design is being conducted for future timekeeping, personnel, vouchering, and financial management systems. Except for some parts of property management which are run on the Administrative Office Wang minicomputer and vouchering, which is provided through the state GAS II system on an Executive Branch computer, these systems are run on the IBM 4300 computer in Springfield. Personal computers are used extensively throughout the Administrative Office for word processing, other desktop functions (e.g., spreadsheets, database applications), and office automation in conjunction with the Wang minicomputer.

Most automation efforts in the Administrative Office have been devoted to the development of a new payroll system on a LAN, developing the timekeeping system, arranging for a vouchering capability using GAS II, and doing the preliminary work that will result in several network-based personal computer applications in the Probation Division.

To provide a more accessible data repository and easier systems development, JMIS has implemented IBM's SQL/DS relational database management system which will aid in future systems development. During 1991, JMIS implemented several system development tools that will supplement SQL/DS and enhance staff productivity.

To accommodate the additional systems and databases to be developed and run on the mainframe computers, the VM operating system was implemented on the IBM 4381 computer in Springfield. Also completed in 1991, was the migration to a more powerful set of system and communications control software and hardware to accommodate a movement toward a statewide data repository and communications. Communications hardware was installed in the offices of the clerks of the Supreme Court and downstate Appellate Court districts that will provide dial-in access (and future LAN access) to the planned communications network.

A major long-term initiative for JMIS will be to establish a statewide telecommunications capability that will link all of the courts to Administrative Office computers. This will feed information into a statewide date respository, will relieve the courts of the burden of submitting manual reports, will place vastly greater quantities of information at the disposal of those who manage and monitor the activities of the courts, and will yield tremendous savings to the entire judicial branch. The first step is complete; it consisted of modernizing the capabilities of personal computers throughout the Supreme Court and Appellate Court to permit easier and more standardized communications with each other and with the mainframe computers on which the Supreme Court and Appellate Court systems are run. As a by product, legal reference services such as Westlaw and Lexis can be accessed directly from many of these personal computers thereby saving the costs of leasing terminals. The second step in the telecommunications initiative is an outgrowth of automated disposition reporting described above in which submissions currently are limited to eight counties and are accomplished by sending data on magnetic tape through the mail. To achieve needed expansion of disposition reporting and to facilitate the telecommunications initiative, a migration from the labor-intensive magnetic tape method to entirely electronic transmissions using modern telecommunications is envisioned.

In addition to the constantly expanding number of installed personal computers and related equipment and software, a concerted effort is being made to put to even greater use the more than 600 personal computers that are now installed in the offices of judges, clerks, legal researchers, and AOIC personnel. Expanded uses of personal computers that are being investigated include increased access to data repositories and personal computers, additional personal computer-based systems and software package usage, more intra-office communications and device sharing, and the capability for users to define and obtain reports from their personal computers without programmer intervention. A major effort is underway to replace most personal computer devices with more modern devices throughout the Supreme and Appellate Courts and Administrative Office.

To improve services provided by JMIS, information centers have been instituted in Chicago and Springfield for users in those respective areas. The centers are designed to standardize the processing of requests for JMIS services.

Other activities of the JMIS Division include ongoing research to evaluate and keep abreast of the ever-changing hardware, software, and applications technologies. Major efforts are also underway to evaluate recent word processing and spreadsheet software and systems printers. Software to enhance system security was obtained and installed. JMIS staff participated, usually as ex officio members or advisors, in several software user groups and court automation committees.

# LEGAL SERVICES DIVISION

The Legal Services Division was created to support Supreme Court committees, commissions and boards, to analyze legislation and Supreme Court decisions, to perform legal research on matters that are not case related, and to provide legal assistance as "in-house" counsel to other AOIC divisions.

#### **Duties of the Division**

In fulfilling these responsibilities, the Division attorneys provided staff support to the following judicial committees:

- Judicial Conference Study Committee on Complex Litigation
- Administrative Committee of the Illinois Appellate
   Court
- Supreme Court Oversight and Planning Committee for a Judicial Performance Evaluation Program
- Ad Hoc Article V Committee of the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges
- Judicial Conference Study Committee on Juvenile Justice
- Supreme Court Ad Hoc Committee to Study the Organization and Function of the Illinois Judicial Conference

Other duties of the Legal Services Division include the administration of Supreme Court Rule 215(d). This rule allows a court to order an impartial medical examination of a party whose mental or physical condition is an issue. The examination must be made by a member, or members, of a panel of physicians chosen for their special qualifications by the Illinois State Medical Society. The examiner submits a report for the use of the court and the parties, and if the examiner's testimony is required at trial, it will be given without cost to the parties. The charts which follow on pages 61 and 62 provide a profile of the use of Rule 215(d) in 1991.

The Division also administers Supreme Court Rule 711. The rule provides for the temporary licensing of law students or law graduates who have not yet had an opportunity to sit for a bar examination to appear in court, prepare pleadings or briefs, counsel with clients, negotiate in the settlement of claims and prepare and draft legal documents. These services may be performed only for qualified agencies such as legal assistance programs, public defender offices and governmental offices under supervision by a member of the Illinois bar. To be eligible for licensing, a student must be certified for at least 60% of the hourly credits required for graduation and be in good academic standing and eligible under the school's criteria to undertake the activities authorized by the rule. In 1991, 703 temporary licenses were issued.

To assist the Supreme Court in its administrative and supervisory authority over all courts, the Division assigns downstate judges to Cook County. Additionally, the Division serves as liaison with the Attorney General's office in providing legal representation to judges and court personnel sued in their official capacity.

During 1991, the Division Assistant Director continued to author and edit the *Bench and Bar Newsletter*, published monthly by the Illinois State Bar Association and distributed to all Illinois judges. The Assistant Director also provided the judiciary with analyses of selected Illinois Supreme Court decisions and recent legislation enacted into law.

The Division, in cooperation with the Intergovernmental Relations Unit, assists the Supreme Court in drafting the Annual Report of the Supreme Court to the General Assembly. The constitutionally mandated report proffers legislative recommendations to the Illinois General Assembly.

During each legislative session, a major part of the workload of the Legal Services Division is the analysis of legislation monitored by the Supreme Court, the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges, and the Supreme Court Committee on Legislation. The analyses are drafted by the Legal Assistant, with lawyer oversight. During the 1991 legislative session, 125 bills were analyzed.

Other responsibilities of the Legal Services Division include:

- Tracking cases and serving as reporter of decisions for the Courts Commission
- Serving as secretary for the Annual Meeting of the Illinois Appellate Court
- Serving as teller of elections for Cook County Circuit Court associate judge elections in administering Supreme Court Rule 39 - Appointment of Associate Judges
- Compiling election and retention results in Judicial Elections and Judicial retention Election

In 1991, the Study Committee on Juvenile Justice continued with its preparation of a new juvenile law benchbook in response to the 1987 recodification of the Juvenile Court Act. The staff liaison attorney managed the benchbook project by providing research assistance and by reviewing and editing numerous drafts of the benchbook. The benchbook is scheduled for completion in 1992.

During 1991, the Division processed over 100 requests for legal assistance from other AOIC divisions. Such requests covered a wide range of subjects including, for example, review of professional service contracts, data processing contracts, leases for office space for judges and AOIC staff, and memoranda on a broad range of legal matters.

### **PROBATION SERVICES DIVISION**

Section 15 of the "Probation and Probation Officers Act" provides: "The Supreme Court of Illinois may establish a Division of Probation Services whose purpose shall be the development, establishment, promulgation, and enforcement of uniform standards for probation services in the State, and to otherwise carry out the intent of the Act" (III Rev. Stat. ch. 38, par. 204-7). Consistent with its statutory responsibility, the mission of the Probation Services Division is to improve the quality, effectiveness, and professionalism of probation and related court services in Illinois. In carrying out this mission, the Division's policy, program, and resource development activities extend to all aspects of the administration and delivery of probation services in Illinois.

During 1991, the Division continued to make progress toward achieving its goal of improving probation services in Illinois. To that end, the Division's ongoing coordination, monitoring, and technical assistance operations continued to be major priorities. In addition to these ongoing responsibilities, the following specific major projects and initiatives were undertaken by the Probation Services Division in 1991.

#### **Juvenile Justice Initiatives**

The Probation Division initiated the next phase of the Juvenile Case Classification project in 1991. A workgroup of probation professionals was convened in the fall. With the assistance of Dr. Art Lurigio of Loyola University, the work group completed preliminary work leading to the validation of a juvenile probation classification instrument which will take place in 1992.

In the spring of 1991 the Probation Division participated in a grant-funded training initiative in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Corrections on "Strategies for Juvenile Supervision." The three one-week training sessions focused on effective case assessment and case planning for juvenile offenders. In the summer of 1991, sixteen of the trainees including nine probation officers and three probation division staff attended a training for trainers session. Planning and development of training materials continued in the fall with scheduled implemetation of the training on a regional basis in 1992. The Probation Division continued to work with individual probation departments on development and implementation of appropriate detention screening criteria. Criteria for most departments were approved in 1991.

#### **Adult Classification System Revisions**

After a thorough review of the National Council on Crime and Delinquency (N.C.C.D.) Adult Classification Validation Study conducted in 1989, the Division made final decisions on the needed revisions to the system. These revisions were incorporated in a rewrite of the Adult Investigation and Supervision System manual. Statewide implementation of the revisions was accomplished through regional training meetings during the spring of 1991.

The Illinois Adult Classification System differentiates the supervision of offenders by measuring their inclination toward criminal behavior and their need for rehabilitative services. The system provides a rational means of supervising offenders differentially, as well as a management tool for staff deployment and accountability, budgeting and research, and resource development and coordination. In short, the system brings structure and consistency to decision making at all levels of adult probation case management.

Properly implemented, this workload classification system sets a uniform standard for state funding and defines the proper allocation of local probation department resources among adult offenders. At the state level, the allocation of new workload positions is based upon comparative staffing needs statewide as established by quarterly workload analyses of each department. The allocation process includes consideration of such factors as the relative proportionality of that department's staffing need, the characteristics of the department's probation population (i.e., the percentage of "high-risk" cases), and the ability of the department to assimilate new resources.

#### Intensive Probation Supervision Expansion

The Intensive Probation Supervision (IPS) Program was instituted in 1984. The primary purpose of this program is to create a dispositional alternative for the courts to place select felony offenders into a highly structured community supervision program instead of committing them to the Illinois Department of Corrections.

In state fiscal year 1991, the Supreme Court's appropriation included, in the probation grants-in-aid line, funding for 60 additional IPS officer positions, which were phased in during FY 1991.

Twelve new IPS program sites were selected for program implementation and nine of the existing thirteen program sites were targeted for expansion. Divison staff conducted new site regional orientation meetings for probation and other court officials and provided on-site technical assistance in the development of all new programs.

### Automation of the Probation Division

During the latter part of 1990, the first steps were taken to expand the capabilities of the Division through automation. Equipment was purchased to provide more staff with word processing capabilities and to begin the development of a local area network system (LAN) within the Division. Initial installation of the LAN took place in 1991 and work continues on the automation of many of the Division's routine functions.

Ultimately, the LAN will link all staff within the Division. This will provide office management efficiencies by sending phone messages, scheduling meetings, memo transmissions, word processing, and on-line data access via the LAN.

#### **Drug Testing Standards**

Many Illinois probation departments have implemented offender drug testing programs as an enhanced supervision strategy. The development of drug testing guidelines by the American Probation and Parole Association and the National Association of Pretrial Services Agencies provided initiative for the Probation Division to develop standards for drug testing in Illinois.

This project began in 1991 and the standards were completed by the end of the year. Statewide promulgation and monitoring of the standards, as well as the provision of technical assistance, is planned for early 1992.

#### **Guidelines for Electronic Monitoring**

Many Illinois probation departments have also implemented electronic monitoring programs for offenders placed on home confinement, and in 1991 the Division developed statewide guidelines for the implementation of such programs. The electronic monitoring guidelines were completed late in 1991 and are scheduled for distribution and implementation early in 1992.

#### **Cutback Management Strategies**

In state fiscal year 1992, beginning on July 1, 1991, Illinois probation departments suffered significant reductions in state reimbursements to counties for probation services. In addition to a ten percent reduction in appropriations, the state failed to annualize the cost of 150 new positions phased-in during FY 1991. As a result of these cuts, the Divison developed various management and fiscal strategies designed to assist probation departments in maximizing their limited resources in order to minimize staff layoffs and reductions in services.

Appropriations for professional training of probation

personnel were reduced by 85 percent, and the provision of basic training for new employees was therefore established as a priority. However, given the low level of funding, the Division was not able to provide basic training for all eligible personnel, and a waiting list became necessary. With virtually no funds for advanced and/or specialized training, the Division requested and received approval from the Supreme Court to seek grant funding for training, and experienced some success in securing funds for such purposes.

# AGE OF PENDING CASES REPORTS

Since June 30, 1979, the Supreme Court, through the Administrative Office, has required chief circuit judges, individual trial judges and circuit clerks to submit the following semi-annual reports on pending cases:

*Chief Judges* — Summary age of pending cases report for each county, which includes (1) number of untried felony cases pending; (2) number of untried felony cases more than 180 days old (over five years old in Cook County); (3) steps taken or to be taken to insure the prompt disposition of such cases; (4) number of cases dismissed under the "speedy trial statute" (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 38, par. 103-5); (5) number of untried law jury cases (over \$15,000) pending; (6) number of untried law jury cases (over \$15,000) more than two years old (over seven years old in Cook County); (7) a report on any category of cases in which there is unusual delay noted; and (8) number of complaints from attorneys or citizens concerning delay in processing cases.

*Trial Judges* — (1) Individual reports on untried felony cases pending over 180 days (over five years old in Cook County); and (2) individual reports on untried law jury cases (over \$15,000) pending over two years (over seven years old in Cook County).

*Clerks* — Composite age of pending cases report for all cases by category, except traffic, ordinance and conservation violations.

#### SECRETARIAT

The Administrative Office serves as secretary to many judicial organizations and committees. In addition to arranging meetings, recording minutes, and keeping records, the office acts as a fact finding body, performs research, conducts surveys and apprises judges of recent developments in procedural and substantive law. Among the bodies served by the Administrative Office in a secretariat capacity are (1) the Executive Committee of the Judicial Conference and its constituent committees, including the standing Subcommittee on Judicial Education, the Associate Judge Seminar Coordinating Committee and various study and seminar committees; (2) the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges; (3) the Supreme Court Rules Committee; and (4) other study and advisory committees which may be appointed by the Supreme Court. In addition, the Administrative Director of the Administrative Office serves as secretary to the Courts Commission. The activities of these organizations are explained in greater detail in other sections of this report.

# ADMINISTRATION OF SUPREME COURT RULE 39 -APPOINTMENT OF ASSOCIATE JUDGES

Article VI, section 8, of the Constitution of Illinois provides that each circuit court shall have such number of associate judges as provided by law with said associate judges to be appointed by the circuit judges in each circuit as theSupreme Court shall provide by rule. The number authorized in each circuit, as provided in sections 2 and 3 of the Associate Judges Act (III. Rev. Stat., ch. 37, pars. 160.2, 160.2-1), is determined by formula based on population and other factors, or a determination by the Supreme Court that a need exists in a given circuit for additional associate judges.

When a vacancy exists in an associate judgeship, the vacancy is filled by appointment of the circuit judges in accordance with procedures prescribed of Supreme Court Rule 39. After notice is given by the chief judge of the circuit to the members of the bar of the circuit that the vacancy exists and will be filled by the judges of the circuit, any attorney licensed to practice law in Illinois may file with the chief judge an application on the form prescribed and furnished by the Administrative Director. The chief judge then certifies the names of candidates to the Administrative Director for inclusion on a ballot mailed to each circuit judge in the circuit. Ballots returned to the Administrative Director are counted and the results tabulated and certified to the chief judge, the secrecy of the ballots being maintained, after which the successful applicant is then declared to be appointed by the circuit judges.

### ADMINISTRATION OF SUPREME COURT RULE 215(d) IMPARTIAL MEDICAL EXPERTS

The Administrative Director is charged with the responsibility of administering Supreme Court Rule 215(d), which allows a court to order an impartial medical examination of a party whose mental or physical condition is an issue. The examination must be made by a member, or members, of a panel of physicians chosen for their special qualifications by the Illinois State Medical Society. The examiner submits a report for the use of the court and the parties, and if the examiner's testimony is required at trial, it will be given without cost to the parties.

The charts which follow provide a profile of the use of Rule 215(d), both cumulative since 1970. The 1991 statistical summary is divided into the categories of "orders", "examinations" and "costs", which refer to those entered, performed or charged in that year.

# **LEGISLATION AFFECTING THE COURTS**

The following summaries of select public acts affected the organization, structure and/or operation of the Illinois courts during 1991

### **Circuit Clerks Fee Statutes**

P.A. 87-669 amends fee statutes. EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1992. Amends Clerks of Courts Act in ch. 25 as follows: in par. 27.2 (circuit clerk fee statute) makes fees therein applicable only to DuPage County (counties having a population in excess of 650,000 "but less than 3,000,000"); adds new par. 27.2a, applicable only to Cook County ("counties having a population of 3,000,000 or more"), establishing new and increased fees for circuit clerk, e.g., jury demand fee increased from \$180 to \$250, expungement petition increased from \$30 to \$60; \*in par. 27.3a (court automation fee) \$3 fee changed to fee not less than \$1 nor more than \$3 in all counties except Cook and in Cook County fee increased to \$5, and Cook County treasurer exempted from placing automation fees in specially designated "court automation fund" (\* N.B. According to P.A. 87-671, the amendment to par. 27.3a wrought by this public act, if enacted into law, which it was, then par. 27.3a is amended (eff. Jan. 1, 1992) to make the court automation fee, without regard to county population, not less than \$1 nor more than \$5 and to eliminate the exception for the Cook County treasurer); in par. 27.3b (payment of traffic and petty offense and misdemeanor fines and costs by credit card) circuit clerk in Cook County entitled to \$5 (was \$3) service fee. Amends Counties Code in ch. 34 by making par. 4-2002 (state's attorney fees) applicable to counties other than Cook and in new par. 4-2002a creates new and increased fees for Cook County State's Attorney; in par. 4-12001 (Cook County sheriff's fees) increases fees of sheriff.

P.A. 87-670 amends fee statutes. EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1992. Amends Clerks of Courts Act in ch. 25 as follows. Par. 27.1 (circuit clerk fee statute) amended to make fees therein applicable to counties having a population of 180,000 (was 650,000) or less. New par. 27.1a creates a new circuit clerk fee schedule for "counties having a population in excess of 180,000 but less than 650,000." Par. 27.2 amended to make circuit clerk fees therein applicable to only DuPage county (counties having a population in excess of 650,000 "but less than 3,000,000") but, "In addition, the fees provided in this section shall apply to all units of local government and school districts in counties with more than 3.000.000 inhabitants." New par. 27.2a. applicable to Cook County only ("counties having a population of 3,000,000 or more"), establishing new and increased fees for circuit clerk but not identical to fee schedule established in P.A. 87-669. Pars. 27.3a (court automation fee) and 27.3c (document storage fee) amended to provide that said fees "may be waived only if the judge

specifically provides for the waiver of the court automation fee" or "of the court document storage fee" and increase maximum automation and document storage fee to \$5 (was \$3). New par. 27.5 provides as follows: "All fees, fines, costs, additional penalties, bail balances assessed or forfeited, and any other amount paid by a person to the circuit clerk, except restitution under [ch. 38, par. 1005-5-6], reimbursement for the costs of an emergency response as provided under [ch. 38, par. 1005-5-3], any fees collected \*\*\* under [Supreme Court Rule 529(c)], any fee collected on behalf of a State's Attorney under [ch. 34 par. 4-2002] or a sheriff under [ch. 34, par. 4-5001], or any cost imposed under [ch. 38, par. 180-3], for any violation of [ch. 95 1/2, pars. 3-100 et. seq., 4-100 et seq., 6-100 et seq. et seq. and 11-100 et. seq.], or a similar provision of a local ordinance, and any violation of [ch. 95 1/2, par. 1101 et seq.], or a similar provision of a local ordinance, shall be distributed within 60 days after receipt by the circuit clerk as follows: 47% \*\*\* to the entity authorized by law to receive the fine imposed in the case; 12% \*\*\* to the State Treasurer; and 41% \*\*\* to the county's general corporate fund. [The 12% paid to the State Treasurer is then allocated to various special funds, e.g., Drivers Education Fund, and the amounts deposited in these funds cannot exceed 110%, for FY '92 and '93, of the amounts deposited in FY '91 but if the amounts exceed 110%, then they are to be distributed to the county general fund and entity entitled to receive the fine.] Not later than March 1 of each year the circuit clerk shall submit a report of the amount of funds remitted to the State Treasurer under this section and during the preceding year based upon independent verification of fines and fees. All counties shall be subject to this section, except that counties [other than Cook] may, by ordinance, elect not to be subject to this section. For offenses subject to this section, judges shall impose one total sum of money payable for violations. The circuit clerk may add on no additional amounts except for [court automation and court document storage fees], unless those amounts are specifically waived by the judge. With respect to money collected by the circuit clerk as a result of forfeiture of bail, ex parte judgment or guilty plea pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 529, the circuit clerk shall first deduct and pay amounts required [for court automation and court document storage funds]. This section is a denial and limitation of home rule powers and functions \*\*\*." To coordinate new par. 27.5 with other statutes, about 15 statutes are amended with phrases such as "unless the fee [fine, etc.] is subject to disbursement by the circuit clerk as provided under" new par. 27.5 of ch. 25 or "All fines and penalties imposed under this section for any violation of [ch. 95 1/2. pars. 3-100 eq seq., 4-100 et. seq., 6-10 et. seq., and 11-100 et seq., or a similar provision of a local ordinance, and any violation of [ch. 95 1/2, par. 1101 et seq.], or a similar provision of a local ordinance, shall be collected and disbursed by the circuit clerk as provided under" par. 27.5 of ch. 25.

P.A. 87-671 amends Clerks of Courts Act in ch. 25. EF-FECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1992. Amends par. 27.3a (court automation fee) as indicated in the note to the summary of P.A. 87-669 *supra* and provides the automation fee "may be waived only if the judge specifically provides for the waiver of the court automation fee." Adds new par. 27.5 which is virtually identical to the new par. 27.5 provided in P.A. 87-670 summarized above, except violations of ch. 95 1/2, par. 12-100 *et seq.* are also excluded from par. 27.5's operation. Illinois Vehicle Code in ch. 95 1/2 amended in par. 2-120 (disposition of fines and forfeitures) to exclude from Secretary of State's administration fines and penalties subject to disbursement by circuit clerk under par. 27.5 of ch. 25.

### **Courthouse Construction**

P.A. 87-320 amends Counties Code in ch. 34. EFFEC-TIVE SEPTEMBER 6, 1991. Adds new par. 6-4010 providing that county having population under 300,000 may by county board resolution incur indebtedness for reconstruction and remodeling of courthouse or construction of new courthouse and purchase of land and may issue and sell bonds and levy taxes to pay bonds. Issuance of bonds subject to referendum.

### **Court Reporters**

P.A. 87-481 amends Illinois Certified Shorthand Reporters Act of 1984 in ch. 111. EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 13, 1991. Amends par. 6203 by adding new first sentence, "No person may practice shorthand reporting on a temporary or permanent basis in this State without being certified under this Act." In par. 6223(a) amount of fine Department of Professional Regulation may impose increased from \$1,000 to \$5,000. New par. 6243 provides: "On a specified date determined by the Department and established in its rules and regulations, every person certified under this Act shall be required to complete 20 hours of continuing education over a 2 year period in a manner as determined by the rules and regulations of the Department promulgated in consultation with the [Certified Shorthand Reporters] Board." New par. 6242 provides that every shorthand reporter "shall print his or her name and license or restricted license number on each transcript reported."

### **Criminal Law & Procedure and Sentencing**

P.A. 87-466 creates the Statewide Grand Jury Act in ch. 38 and amends other statutes. EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1992. New pars. 1701 through 1710, in ch. 38, contain new grand jury act, the purpose of which is "to create a limited, multicounty Statewide Grand Jury with authority to investigate, indict and prosecute narcotic activity", *i.e.*, "violations of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, the Cannabis Control Act, the Narcotics Profit Forfeiture Act, the Cannabis and Controlled Substances Tax Act, any other criminal offense committed in the course of such a violation, and for the offense of money laundering" and Statewide Grand Jury matters related thereto, e.g., perjury, subornation of perjury, communicating with or harassment of jurors and witnesses. Offenses must involve acts occurring in more than one county. Attorney General's application for appointment of a circuit judge to convene and preside over the grand jury to be made to Illinois Chief Justice who "shall appoint a Circuit Judge" from the circuit where the grand jury is sought to be convened, and circuit judge will decide whether grand jury should be convened. County where Statewide Grand Jury sits shall pay grand jury's expenses which the Attorney General will reimburse. Other provisions relating to, e.g., venue, procedures, grant of immunity. Amends in ch. 38 par. 1-6 (place of trial) regarding narcotics racketeering, money laundering and cannabis/controlled substances trafficking. Amends certain provisions in ch. 561/2 regarding narcotics racketeering.

### Family Law and Related Matters

P.A. 87-381 amends Clerks of Courts Act in ch. 25. EF-FECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1992. In par. 27.1(i) (reinstatement), applicable to counties having population of 650,000 or less, excepts from \$20 circuit clerk fee "a petition to modify, terminate, or enforce a judgment or order for child or spousal support or to modify, suspend, or terminate an order for withholding." In par. 27.2(g) (petition to vacate or modify), applicable to counties having more than 650,000 population, subpars. (1), (2) amended to except from \$40 to \$60 circuit clerk fee petition "to modify, terminate, or enforce a judgment or order for child or spousal support, or to modify, suspend, or terminate an order for withholding."

### Judges

P.A. 87-145, titled "An Act concerning local government, amending named Acts," amends *inter alia* Circuit Courts Act and Associate Judges Act in ch. 37. EFFECTIVE AUGUST 19, 1991. Adds new par. 72.2g which creates new circuit judgeships to be filled in 1992 election: 3 in 19th Circuit, 2 to be residents of and elected from Lake County and 1 to be a resident of and elected from McHenry County; 3 in 18th Circuit to be elected at large; 1 in 16th Circuit to be a resident of and elected from Kane County. Amends par. 160.2(a) (population formula associate judgeships) by reducing minimum population from 305,000 to 303,000 for a circuit to have 10 associate judges (apparently affects only 7th Circuit).

### **Judicial Elections**

P.A. 87-9 creates Cook County Apportionment Act of 1991. EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1991. Adds in ch. 37 new pars.

901, 902, 903 which implement P.A. 86-1478 (see III. Rev. Stat. 1990 Supp., ch. 37, par. 72.2f(a) ), the Cook County subcircuiting law. Using census tract and block numbers and occasional references to townships within Cook County as they appear on the maps for the 1990 census, the Act sets out the boundary lines, in words, of the 15 subcircuits from which "subcircuit judges" will be elected; e.g., "Judicial Subcircuit No. 1 shall be comprised of the following Tracts in Cook County: 4310 through 4313 \*\*\*; the following Blocks in Cook County: 109, 201 through 207 \*\*\*." Provides for placing in a subcircuit, that is included in more than one subcircuit or that is in other defined circumstances. Census maps used in drawing subcircuit boundaries to be transmitted to Secretary of State for deposit in State Archives. "State Board of Elections shall prepare and make available to the public a metes and bounds description of the subcircuits \*\*\*."

### Jurors

P.A. 87-616 amends juror statutes. EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1992. Makes same amendment in Jury Act and Jury Commission Act (ch. 78, pars. 4.1(c), (h), 33.1(c), (h) (jury duty, notice to employer, right to time off)) (underlined language added): "(c) If an employee gives reasonable notice of required jury service, any employer who violates the provisions of this Section: (1) may be changed with contempt of court. In such event, the State's Attorney shall file a petition for civil contempt, criminal contempt, or both, against the employer to be prosecuted by the State's Attorney; and (2) shall be liable for damages for any loss of wages or other benefits suffered by an employee by reason of the violation; and (3) [was (2)] may be enjoined \*\*\*. As used in this section, reasonable notice of required jury service means that the employee summoned for jury duty must deliver to the employer a copy of the summons within 10 days of the date of issuance of the summons to the employer.\*\*\* (h) The official responsible for issuing the summons may advise the juror of his rights under this Act by printed insert with the summons or on the summons itself."

### **Probation Fund and Sentencing Statutes**

P.A. 87-609 and 87-610 amend probation fund and sentencing statutes. BOTH EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 18, 1991. These public acts in some instances make identical changes in ch. 38; where the changes are different, the public act making the change will be noted. Amends Probation and Probation Officers Act in ch. 38 par. 204-7.1 (probation and court services fund) as follows: in subpar. (a) fees to be also collected pursuant to new par. 1005-6-3.1(i) (defendants placed on supervision), and county tresurer's annual report to supreme court provision deletes "showing the total amount in the probation services fund of the county"; in subpar. (b) <u>underlined</u> language added, [bracketed] language deleted), "Monies \*\*\* shall be appropriated by the county board to be used

\*\*\* in accordance with policies and guidelines approved by the Supreme Court for costs of operating the probation and court services department or departments; however, monies in the probation and court services fund shall not be used for the payment of salaries of probation and court services personnel. [, submitted in each county's annual probation plan for the purchase of services for probationers with special needs and for the purchase of equipment for use of the county's probation department.]" Unified Code of Corrections in ch. 38 amended: in par. 1005-5-6 (restitution) in subpar. (f) new last sentence added, "If the defendant is ordered to restitution and the court orders that restitution is to be paid over a period greater than 6 months, the court shall order that the defendant make monthly payments; the court may waive this requirement of monthly payments only if there is a specific finding of good cause for waiver" (P.A. 87-610), and new subpar. (h) added, "The judge may enter an order of withholding to collect the amount of restitution owed in accordance with" ch. 110, par. 12-801 et seq. (P.A. 87-609); in par. 1006-5-3 (probation conditional discharge conditions) subpar. (i) amended (underlined language added, [bracketed] language deleted), "The court shall impose upon an offender sentenced \*\*\* to conditional discharge after January 1, 1992, as a condition of such \*\*\* conditional discharge a fee not to exceed \$25 for month of \*\*\* conditional discharge supervision \*\*\*, unless after determining the inability of the person sentenced to \*\*\* conditional discharge to pay the fee, the court assesses a lesser fee. The fee shall be imposed only upon an offender who is actively supervised by the probation and court services department. \*\*\*; in par. 1005-6-3.1 (supervision conditions) new subpar. (i) tracking probation and court services fee of up to \$25 a month statute applicable to probationers (par. 1005-6-3(i)) added - defendants "placed on supervision after January 1, 1992," shall be ordered by court to pay monthly fee up to \$25 "as a condition of supervision" if defendant actively supervised by probation and court services department; new par. 1005-9-4 (order of withholding) added, "The court may enter an order of withholding to collect the amount of a fine imposed on an offender in accordance with" ch. 110, par. 12-801 et seq. (P.A. 87-609).

### **Public Defender**

P.A. 87-111 amends the Public Defender and Appointed Counsel division of the Counties Code in ch. 34. EFFEC-TIVE AUGUST 9, 1991. Adds new par. 3-4000: "Legislative declaration. The General Assembly recognizes that quality legal representation in criminal and related proceedings is a fundamental right of the people of the State of Illinois and that there should be no distinction in the availability of quality legal representation based upon a person's inability to pay. Therefore, it is the intent of the General Assembly to provide for effective county public defender systems throughout the State and encourage the active and substantial participation of the private bar in the representation of indigent defendants." Amends pars. 3-4004, 3-4008 and 3-4010 by expecting Cook County from their application. Adds new pars. 3-4000.1, 3-4004.1, 3-4008.1 and 3-4010.1 providing for the Public Defender of Cook County: "properly qualified person" to be appointed by president of county board with board's advice and consent; qualifications and terms of employment set forth, e.g., licensed to practice law for at least 5 years, cannot engage in private practice of law, 6 year term, salary to be "comparable with that paid to circuit court judges", but not to exceed state's attorney's salary; public defender authorized to hire lawyers and other support personnel whose salaries are fixed by county board; public defender to keep records and file with county board president quarterly reports.

### Warrant and Complaint Statutes

P.A. 87-523 amends warrant and complaint statutes. EF-FECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1992. Adds in Code of Criminal Procedure in ch. 38 par. 107-9(f) (arrest warrant issued on complaint): "The warrant may be issued electronically or electromagnetically by use of a facsimile transmission machine and any such warrant shall have the same validity as a written warrant." Same addition made in par. 108-4 (search warrant issuance) and in Criminal Jurisprudence Act in ch. 38 in par. 200-3 amended by adding, "The complaint may be issued electronically or electromagnetically by use of a facsimile transmission machine and any such complaint shall have the same validity as a written complaint."

### TREND OF CASES IN THE SUPREME COURT **DURING 1991**

## APPENDIX A CONSTITUTION OF 1970 ARTICLE VI — THE JUDICIARY

#### Section 1. Courts

The judicial power is vested in a Supreme Court, an Appellate Court and Circuit Courts.

#### Section 2. Judicial Districts

The State is divided into five Judicial Districts for the selection of Supreme and Appellate Court Judges. The First Judicial District consists of Cook County. The remainder of the State shall be divided by law into four Judicial Districts of substantially equal population, each of which shall be compact and composed of contiguous counties.

#### Section 3. Supreme Court — Organization

The Supreme Court shall consist of seven Judges. Three shall be selected from the First Judicial District and one from each of the other Judicial Districts. Four Judges constitute a quorum and the concurrence of four is necessary for a decision. Supreme Court Judges shall select a Chief Justice from their number to serve for a term of three years.

#### Section 4. Supreme Court - Jurisdiction

(a) The Supreme Court may exercise original jurisdiction in cases relating to revenue, mandamus, prohibition or habeas corpus and as may be necessary to the complete determination of any case on review.

(b) Appeals from judgments of Circuit Courts imposing a sentence of death shall be directed to the Supreme Court as a matter of right. The Supreme Court shall provide by rule for direct appeal in other cases.

(c) Appeals from the Appellate Court to the Supreme Court are a matter of right if a question under the Constitution of the United States or of this State arises for the first time in and as a result of the action of the Appellate Court, or if a division of the Appellate Court certifies that a case decided by it involves a question of such importance that the case should be decided by the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court may provide by rule for appeals from the Appellate Court in other cases.

#### Section 5. Appellate Court Organization

The number of Appellate Judges to be selected from each Judicial District shall be provided by law. The Supreme Court shall prescribe by rule the number of Appellate divisions in each Judicial District. Each Appellate division shall have at least three judges. Assignments to divisions shall be made by the Supreme Court. A majority of a division constitutes a quorum and the concurrence of a majority of the division is necessary for a decision. There shall be at least one division in each Judicial District and each division shall sit at times and places prescribed by rules of the Supreme Court.

#### Section 6. Appellate Court Jurisdiction

Appeals from final judgments of a Circuit Court are a matter of right to the Appellate Court in the Judicial District in which the Circuit Court is located except in cases appealable directly to the Supreme Court and except that after a trial on the merits in a criminal case, there shall be no appeal from a judgment of acquittal. The Supreme Court may provide by rule for appeals to the Appellate Court from other than final judgments of Circuit Courts. The Appellate Court may exercise original jurisdiction when necessary to the complete determination of any case on review. The Appellate Court shall have such powers of direct review of administrative action as provided by law.

#### Section 7. Judicial Circuits

(a) The State shall be divided into Judicial Circuits consisting of one or more counties. The First Judicial District shall constitute a Judicial Circuit. The Judicial Circuits within the other Judicial Districts shall be as provided by law. Circuits composed of more than one county shall be compact and of contiguous counties. The General Assembly by law may provide for the division of a circuit for the purpose of selection of Circuit Judges and for the selection of Circuit Judges from the circuit at large.

(b) Each Judicial Circuit shall have one Circuit Court with such number of Circuit Judges as provided by law. Unless otherwise provided by law, there shall be at least one Circuit Judge from each county. In the First Judicial District, unless otherwise provided by law, Cook County, Chicago, and the area outside of Chicago shall be separate units for the selection of Circuit Judges, with at least twelve chosen at large from the area outside Chicago and at least thirty-six chosen at large from Chicago.

(c) Circuit Judges in each circuit shall select by secret ballot a Chief Judge from their number to serve at their pleasure. Subject to the authority of the Supreme Court, the Chief Judge shall have general administrative authority over his court, including authority to provide for divisions, general or specialized, and for appropriate times and places of holding court.

#### Section 8. Associate Judges

Each Circuit Court shall have such number of Associate Judges as provided by law. Associate Judges shall be appointed by the Circuit Judges in each circuit as the Supreme Court shall provide by rule. In the First Judicial District, unless otherwise provided by law, at least one-fourth of the Associate Judges shall be appointed from, and reside, outside Chicago. The Supreme Court shall provide by rule for matters to be assigned to Associate Judges.

#### Section 9. Circuit Courts — Jurisdiction

Circuit Courts shall have original jurisdiction of all justiciable matters except when the Supreme Court has original and exclusive jurisdiction relating to redistricting of the General Assembly and to the ability of the Governor to serve or resume office. Circuit Courts shall have such power to review administrative action as provided by law.

#### Section 10. Terms of Office

The terms of office of Supreme and Appellate Court Judges shall be ten years; of Circuit Judges, six years; and of Associate Judges, four years.

#### Section 11. Eligibility for Office

No person shall be eligible to be a Judge or Associate Judge unless he is a United States citizen, a licensed attorney-at-law of this State, and a resident of the unit which selects him. No change in the boundaries of a unit shall affect the tenure in office of a Judge or Associate Judge incumbent at the time of such change.

#### Section 12. Election and Retention

(a) Supreme, Appellate and Circuit Judges shall be nominated at primary elections or by petition. Judges shall be elected at general or judicial elections as the General Assembly shall provide by law. A person eligible for the office of Judge may cause his name to appear on the ballot as a candidate for Judge at the primary and at the general or judicial elections by submitting petitions. The General Assembly shall prescribe by law the requirements for petitions.

(b) The office of a Judge shall be vacant upon his death, resignation, retirement, removal, or upon the conclusion of his term without retention in office. Whenever an additional Appellate or Circuit Judge is authorized by law, the office shall be filled in the manner provided for filling a vacancy in that office.

(c) A vacancy occurring in the office of Supreme, Appellate or Circuit Judge shall be filled as the General Assembly may provide by law. In the absence of a law, vacancies may be filled by appointment by the Supreme Court. A person appointed to fill a vacancy 60 or more days prior to the next primary election to nominate Judges shall serve until the vacancy is filled for a term at the next general or judicial election. A person appointed to fill a vacancy less than 60 days prior to the next primary election to nominate Judges shall serve until the vacancy is filled at the second general or judicial election following such appointment.

(d) Not less than six months before the general election preceding the expiration of his term of office, a Supreme, Appellate or Circuit Judge who has been elected to that office may file in the office of the Secretary of State a declaration of candidacy to succeed himself. The Secretary of State, not less than 63 days before the election, shall certify the Judges candidacy to the proper election officials. The names of Judges seeking retention shall be submitted to the electors, separately and without party designation, on the sole question whether each Judge shall be retained in office for another term. The retention elections shall be conducted at general elections in the appropriate Judicial District, for Supreme and Appellate Judges, and in the circuit for Circuit Judges. The affirmative vote of three-fifths of the electors voting on the question shall elect the Judge to the office for a term commencing on the first Monday in December following his election.

(e) A law reducing the number of Appellate or Circuit Judges shall be without prejudice to the right of the Judges affected to seek retention in office. A reduction shall become effective when a vacancy occurs in the affected unit.

#### Section 13. Prohibited Activities

(a) The Supreme Court shall adopt rules of conduct for Judges and Associate Judges.

(b) Judges and Associate Judges shall devote full time to judicial duties. They shall not practice law, hold a position of profit, hold office under the United States or this State or unit of local government or school district or in a political party. Service in the State militia or armed forces of the United States for periods of time permitted by rule of the Supreme Court shall not disqualify a person from serving as a Judge or Associate Judge.

#### Section 14. Judicial Salaries And Expenses — Fee Officers Eliminated

Judges shall receive salaries provided by law which shall not be diminished to take effect during their terms of office. All salaries and such expenses as may be provided by law shall be paid by the State, except that Appellate, Circuit and Associate Judges shall receive such additional compensation from counties within their district or circuit as may be provided by law. There shall be no fee officers in the judicial system.

#### Section 15. Retirement — Discipline

(a) The General Assembly may provide by law for the retirement of Judges and Associate Judges at a prescribed age. Any retired Judge or Associate Judge, with his consent, may be assigned by the Supreme Court to judicial service for which he shall receive the applicable compensation in lieu of retirement benefits. A retired Associate Judge may be assigned only as an Associate Judge.

(b) A Judicial Inquiry Board is created. The Supreme Court shall select two Circuit Judges as members and the Governor shall appoint four persons who are not lawyers and three lawyers as members of the Board. No more than two of the lawyers and two of the non-lawyers appointed by the Governor shall be members of the same political party. The terms of Board members shall be four years. A vacancy on the Board shall be filled for a full term in the manner the original appointment was made. No member may serve on the Board more than eight years.

(c) The Board shall be convened permanently, with authority to conduct investigations, receive or initiate complaints concerning a Judge or Associate Judge and file complaints with the Courts Commission. The Board shall not file a complaint unless five members believe that a reasonable basis exists (1) to charge the Judge or Associate Judge with willful misconduct in office, persistent failure to perform his duties, or other conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice or that brings the judicial office into disrepute, or (2) to charge that the Judge or Associate Judge is physically or mentally unable to perform his duties. All proceedings of the Board shall be confidential except the filing of a complaint with the Courts Commission. The Board shall prosecute the complaint.

(d) The Board shall adopt rules governing its procedures. It shall have subpoena power and authority to appoint and direct its staff. Members of the Board who are not Judges shall receive per diem compensation and necessary expenses; members who are Judges shall receive necessary expenses only. The General Assembly by law shall appropriate funds for the operation of the Board.

(e) A Courts Commission is created consisting of one Supreme Court Judge selected by that Court, who shall be its chairman, two Appellate Court Judges selected by that Court, and two Circuit Judges selected by the Supreme Court. The Commission shall be convened permanently to hear complaints filed by the Judicial Inquiry Board. The Commission shall have authority after notice and public hearing, (1) to remove from office, suspend without pay, censure or reprimand a Judge or Associate Judge for willful misconduct in office, persistent failure to perform his duties, or other conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice or that brings the judicial office into disrepute, or (2) to suspend, with or without pay, or retire a Judge or Associate Judge who is physically or mentally unable to perform his duties.

(f) The concurrence of three members of the Commission shall be necessary for a decision. The decision of the Commission shall be final.

(g) The Commission shall adopt rules governing its procedures and shall have power to issue subpoenas. The General Assembly shall provide by law for the expenses of the Commission.

#### Section 16. Administration

General administrative and supervisory authority over all courts is vested in the Supreme Court and shall be exercised by the Chief Justice in accordance with its rules. The Supreme Court shall appoint an administrative director and staff, who shall serve at its pleasure, to assist the Chief Justice in his duties. The Supreme Court may assign a Judge temporarily to any court and an Associate Judge to serve as an Associate Judge on any Circuit Court. The Supreme Court shall provide by rule for expeditious and inexpensive appeals.

#### Section 17. Judicial Conference

The Supreme Court shall provide by rule for an annual judicial conference to consider the work of the courts and to suggest improvements in the administration of justice and shall report thereon annually in writing to the General Assembly not later than January 31.

#### Section 18. Clerks of Courts

(a) The Supreme Court and the Appellate Court Judges of each Judicial District, respectively, shall appoint a clerk and other nonjudicial officers for their Court or District.

(b) The General Assembly shall provide by law for the election, or for the appointment by Circuit Judges, of clerks and other nonjudicial officers of the Circuit Courts and for their terms of office and removal for cause.

(c) The salaries of clerks and other nonjudicial officers shall be as provided by law.

#### Section 19. State's Attorneys — Selection, Salary

A State's Attorney shall be elected in each county in 1972 and every fourth year thereafter for a four year term. One State's Attorney may be elected to serve two or more counties if the governing boards of such counties so provide and a majority of the electors of each county voting on the issue approve. A person shall not be eligible for the office of State's Attorney unless he is a United States citizen and a licensed attorney-at-law of this State. His salary shall be provided by law.
