Purpose of the forms:	To ask the court for an <i>Order of Protection</i> .
Types of cases the forms CAN be used for:	 Cases where you have been abused by a family or household member, caregiver, current or ex-romantic partner, or current or ex-spouse, a person with whom you live or used to live, or someone who is the other parent of your child; OR Cases where you are filing for any person who has been abused by a family or household member, but is unable to file on their own.
Types of cases the forms CANNOT be used for:	Cases where none of the above relationships exist.
Cost to file the forms:	None
Special information or papers needed to complete the forms:	 Description of current and past abuse; Names of other people to be protected; Addresses and property you want protected; AND Addresses where the alleged abuser (Respondent) can be found, if known.
