Name of form:	Request for Preparation of Record on Appeal
Purpose of the form:	To have the clerk of the trial court prepare the record on appeal.
Types of cases the form CAN be used for:	All civil appeals.
Types of cases the form CANNOT be used for:	This form cannot be used in criminal cases. This form is filed only with the clerk of the trial court to order the record on appeal and cannot be filed in the appellate court.
Cost to file the form:	The clerk of the trial court may require you to pay a deposit for the cost of the record on appeal unless the trial court approved a <i>Fee Waiver</i> , which can be found at: <u>illinoiscourts.gov/documents-and-forms/approved-forms</u> .
Special information or papers needed to complete	 Any original exhibits the parties kept after trial. Businesses, other than sole preprieterships, cannot represent
the form:	• Businesses, other than sole proprietorships, cannot represent themselves in the appellate court. Talk to a lawyer if you are a business and not a sole proprietorship.
Statutes and rules covering the form:	Illinois Supreme Court Rules 321 and 323

Where to get access to a computer and scanner to file and serve:	The appellate court clerk's office will have a computer and scanner where you can scan, save, and then use the computer to e-file and serve your document.
