ORDER

Effective January 1, 2022, for consistency with new case categories created in the Manual on Recordkeeping – Fourth Edition, the Court’s Order in *In re Electronic Filing in Civil and Criminal Cases and Remote Access Systems* dated May 30, 2017, as amended on January 31, 2019, is further amended by replacing paragraph 5 of the Order as follows:

5. Circuit courts may e-File criminal case types (Criminal Felony (CF), Criminal Misdemeanor (CM), Driving Under the Influence (DT), Domestic Violence (DV), Quasi-criminal (QC)) and juvenile case types (Juvenile (JV), Juvenile Abuse and Neglect (JA), Juvenile Delinquent (JD) in a permissive manner through eFileIL. Criminal and juvenile case initiation in the circuit courts may continue using current practices. Permissive e-Filing through eFileIL does not include quasi-criminal case types: Major Traffic (MT), Minor Traffic (TR), Ordinance (OV), Conservation (CV) and Civil Law Violation (CL).

In all other respects, the May 30, 2017, Order as amended on January 31, 2019, stands in full force and effect.
