Ms Bowne, I am a personal injury lawyer who has practiced in Illinois for the last 33 years representing the injured. Outside of the obvious constitutional issues, and the contravention of our Illinois Supreme Court precedent I suggest this proposal be very closely examined in a couple additional ways.

First, what are the motivations/objectives behind the proposed rule change and if legitimate, how can we shape change that addresses those legitimate interests without trampling individual rights? Exploring true motivations often leads to constructive answers. Pushing a change through without full and thorough examination of the ramifications is simply wrong. Publishing these findings is essential to transparency.

Second, in our digital age, what protections can we as citizens expect against abuse or theft of very private information that would now be accessible in multiple locations with no real assurance of the level of sophistication or commitment to privacy of the holders? Who is responsible when these breaches occur?

This is vital and important work, let's get it right on all levels.
