ORDER

Effective immediately, in furtherance of the Supreme Court's objective to utilize technology to reduce and streamline processes, and to further facilitate statewide electronic filing in the Illinois courts, it is THEREFORE ORDERED that the Court's Order *In re Electronic Filing in Civil and Criminal Cases and Remote Access Systems* dated May 30, 2017, as amended on January 31, 2019 and September 24, 2021, is further amended by replacing paragraph 5 of the Order and adding paragraph 6 as follows:

5. Circuit courts may e-File criminal case types (Criminal Felony (CF), Criminal Misdemeanor (CM), Driving Under the Influence (DT), Domestic Violence (DV), and Quasi-criminal (QC)), quasi-criminal case types (Major Traffic (MT), Minor Traffic (TR), Ordinance Violation (OV), Conservation (CV), and Civil Law (CL)) and juvenile case types (Juvenile (JV), Juvenile Abuse and Neglect (JA), Juvenile Delinquent (JD)) in a permissive manner through eFileIL. Permissive e-Filing of criminal and juvenile cases through eFileIL applies only to filings after the case has been initiated and assigned a case number. Permissive e-Filing of quasi-criminal cases applies to both initial and subsequent filings. Criminal and juvenile case initiation in the circuit courts may continue using current practices.
6. Case initiation for criminal and quasi-criminal case types when a Uniform Citation Form is issued for Criminal Misdemeanor (CM), Quasi-criminal (QC), Driving Under the Influence (DT), Major Traffic (MT), Minor Traffic (TR), Ordinance (OV), Conservation (CV) and Civil Law Violation (CL) offenses may be implemented by any circuit court using a local e-Filing system directly between a law enforcement agency and the circuit clerk until such time as this Court enters an order mandating quasi-criminal e-Filing through eFileIL. At that time all courts, circuit clerks, and law enforcement entities would be required to transition all criminal and quasi-criminal filings through eFileIL.

In all other respects, the May 30, 2017, order as amended on January 31, 2019, and September 24, 2021, stands in full force and effect.
