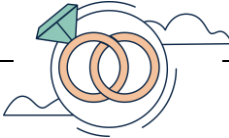

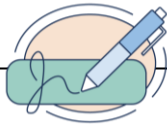

**7. WHAT ARE YOU ASKING THE JUDGE TO DO?**

*Make your official request to the judge to end your marriage or civil union. This section contains requests that are **always included** when filing for divorce.*

I ask the judge to order:

- A. A **Judgment of Dissolution of Marriage/Civil Union (Divorce No Children)** for me and my spouse.
- B. That **each party** gets to keep all of their non-marital/non-civil union property.
- C. A **fair division** of the marital/civil union property.
- D. A **fair division of the debts** obtained during the marriage/civil union.
- E. Each party be assigned their non-marital/non-civil union **debt**.
- F. That maintenance be awarded, if appropriate.
- G. That I be allowed to return to using my former name if I wish.
- H. For any other relief that is appropriate.



SIGN

Under [735 ILCS 5/1-109](#), your signature means that:

- 1) everything in this document is true and correct, or I have been informed or I believe it to be true and correct, and
- 2) I understand that making a false statement on this form is perjury and has penalties provided by law.

If you are filling out this form online, sign your name by typing it. If you are filling out this form by hand, sign and print your name. Enter your complete current address and telephone number. If you need to keep your address secret from your spouse because of domestic violence, you may use another address. That address must be one at which you can receive mail about the case.

NEXT STEP FOR PERSON FILLING OUT THIS FORM:

- File this form with the Circuit Clerk in the county you live in or in the county your spouse lives in. For more information on where to file, go to [ilcourts.info/clerks](#).

- Confirm that the Sheriff has notified your spouse by serving them with the forms.

NEXT STEP FOR PERSON RECEIVING THIS DOCUMENT

- You must file an official form with the court called an *Appearance* and a form called an *Answer or Response* no later than 30 days from the date you received this *Petition* and *Summons*.
- If you do not file an *Appearance* and an *Answer or Response* on time, the judge may decide the case without hearing from you. This is called “default.” As a result, you could lose the case.
